
As summer approaches we are eagerly anticipating (early summer) opening of the Niantic Bay Beach and Boardwalk which will be accessed from Cini Park. Over the past couple of years the community has patiently waited for the Boardwalk to re-open and finally this summer approximately half of it will open

for use. As a result of the construction, a new nine acre beach has been added to our inventory. The Parks and Recreation Commission has adopted policies to treat this beach as an extension of our other beaches. The intention, as of this printing, is to staff the new beach and parking area at Cini Park

with lifeguards and gate attendants once open, through the Labor Day weekend. Parking stickers and day passes will allow entry to all three beaches. I ask for your patience as we manage this great new amenity to our parks inventory.



McCook Point Park

Open daily from 8:00 a.m. to sunset. Restrooms will remain open until mid-November as weather permits. The new Restroom facility was completed in October 2012 and will be open for summer. We appreciate everyone's cooperation during the construction phase.

State Statue

State Statue 22-364 states that dogs must be under the direct control of their owners at all times when using town parks. It is the dog owner's responsibility to clean up all dog waste. Dogs will be allowed on Town beaches from October 1 to April 30, and year round on Amtrak Beach. Dogs are not permitted on the Niantic Bay Boardwalk at any time during the year.

All of our Parks and Beaches are Tobacco Free

McCook Point Park/Hole N' Wall - Parking Permits

Parking permits will go on sale Monday, May 6, at the Parks & Recreation Office. Permits will be sold from 8:30 am to 4:00 pm, Monday through Friday, throughout the season. From May 23 through June 27 the office will extend the office hours to 7:00 pm on Thursdays. To obtain a season permit, all applicants must present their car registration at the time of purchase. If you are new to Town, please bring your tax bill or lease to expedite the process. PLEASE NOTE, to avoid lines, mail in a copy of your registration, a copy of your latest tax bill (if your vehicle is not registered to and East Lyme/Niantic address), the applicable payment (check should be made payable to the TOWN OF EAST LYME) and a self addressed stamped envelope, and we will process your request and mail your beach pass to you.

*Patrons must be in the same family with the car registered to same address.

Non-Resident Seasonal - \$90.00 (included two walk-ins)

Non-Resident Walk-in - \$20.00

Resident Day - \$5.00

Non-Resident Day - \$20.00

Starting on Saturday, May 25 (Memorial Day Weekend) all vehicles must have a parking permit to enter the park through September 2, 2013 (Labor Day). Park hours are 8:00 am to dusk. Lifeguards are on duty daily from 9:00 am to 5:00 pm, beginning June 22 through mid-August.

Pavilion Rental

The pavilion is available for full day or half day rental (9:00 am to 1:00 pm or 1:30 pm until dusk) during the summer season (Memorial Day weekend through Labor Day) for East Lyme/Niantic residents/taxpayers. Please contact the Parks & Recreation office for information and availability.

Niantic Bay Boardwalk

We are anticipating an early summer opening of approximately half of the boardwalk that is accessed from Cini Park. The Hole in the Wall access will remain closed as repairs are expected to begin on this portion in late summer.



All dogs 6 months of age or older must be licensed. Fees for neutered or spayed dogs are \$8.00 and for dogs that are not neutered or not spayed, the fee is \$19.

A certificate of neutering or spaying from a licensed vet must be presented when licensing a dog for the first time.

An up-to-date certificate of rabies vaccination must be presented before a dog can be licensed. The rabies tag is not acceptable.

To license by mail, send all required information (which will be returned) along with a check made payable to Town of East Lyme and mail to East Lyme Town Clerk, PO Box 519, Niantic, CT 06357.

We do require a self-addressed stamped envelope. Postage on the return envelope is 66 cents for the return of the license.

Residential - Recycle or properly dispose of household products that contain chemicals such as insecticides, pesticides, oil-based paint, solvents, and used motor oil and other auto fluids. Don't pour them onto the ground or into storm drains.

Lawn Care - Excess fertilizers and pesticides applied to lawns and gardens wash off and pollute streams. In addition, yard clippings and leaves can wash into storm drains and contribute nutrients and organic matter to streams. Don't overwater your lawn. Consider using a soaker hose instead of a sprinkler. Use pesticides and fertilizers sparingly. When use is necessary, use these chemicals in the recommended amounts. Use organic mulch or safer pest control methods whenever possible. Compost or mulch yard waste - don't leave it in the street or sweep it into storm drains or streams. Cover piles of dirt or mulch being used in landscaping projects.

Auto Care - Washing your car and degreasing auto parts at home can send detergents and other contaminants through the storm sewer system. Dumping automotive fluids into storm drains has the same results as dumping the materials directly into a water body. Use a commercial car wash that treats or recycles its wastewater or wash your car on your yard so the water infiltrates into the ground. Repair leaks and dispose of used auto fluids and batteries at designated drop-off or recycling locations.

Pet Waste - Pet waste can be a major source of bacteria and excess nutrients in local waters. When walking your pet, remember to pick up the waste and dispose of it properly. Flushing pet

waste is the best disposal method. Leaving pet waste on the ground increases public health risks by allowing harmful bacteria and nutrients to wash into the storm drain and eventually into local water bodies.

Septic Systems - Leaking and poorly maintainer septic systems release nutrients and pathogens (bacteria and viruses) that can be picked up by stormwater and discharged into nearby water bodies. Pathogens can cause public health problems and environmental concerns. **Inspect your system every 3 years** and pump your tank as necessary (every 3 to 5 years). Don't dispose of household hazardous waste in sinks or toilets.

Residential Landscaping - Permeable Pavement - Traditional concreted and asphalt surfaces don't allow water to soak into the ground. Instead these surfaces rely on storm drains to divert unwanted water. Permeable pavement systems allow rain and snowmelt to soak through, decreasing stormwater runoff.

Rain Barrels - You can collect rainwater from rooftops in mosquito-proof containers. The water can be used later on lawns or garden areas. Rain Gardens and Grassy Swales - Specially designed areas planted with native plants can provide natural places for rainwater to collect and soak into the ground. Rain from rooftop areas or paved areas can be diverted into these areas rather than into storm drains.

Vegetated Filter Strips - Filter strips are areas of native grass or plants created along roadways or streams. They trap the pollutants stormwater picks up as it flows across driveways and streets.



Single Stream Recycling

In single stream recycling recyclables are separated at the processing plant and not at your home. This means that all recycling can be placed in a single container separate from the trash container and can be compacted resulting in reduced transportation costs. No other containers are used for recycling. A gray recycling can is the only one that will be picked up.

Recycling collection has been moved to a cycle of every other week. To view the single stream recycling calendar visit our web site at www.eltownhall.com/public works.

Single stream accepts all plastics with the exception of plastic bags and Styrofoam. As with your trash can the recycling can must have a four-foot separation from other objects including your trash can.
