First Selectman's Corner

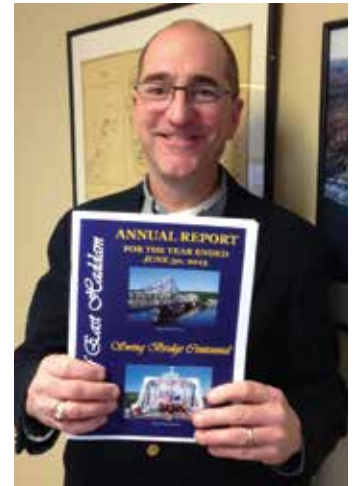
I came into office during the financial crisis, a time that ushered in a period of renewed focus on government spending. When the economy faltered, we all had to make difficult changes in our own lives in order to press on. As you sat at your kitchen tables making tough decisions, I was hard at work at the bargaining table, doing my best to figure out how government could do more with less. I am proud to have led the Board of Selectmen to work with our Board of Finance to propose budgets in line with our economy. Our fiscal conservatism was cited by one of the Nation's top rating agencies (Standard and Poor's) in November when it affirmed our Town's rating at AA+, one notch below its top score.

That credit score is crucial to us for one reason; it is a key reference point investors look to when considering how likely the Town is to repay our debts. When necessary we borrow from these investors to finance large capital projects, and this score helps determine our interest rates, similar to how your credit score impacts the rate the banks lend money to your household. Since 2008 the Town has deferred borrowing to make capital improvements; a strategic decision that was crucial to minimizing tax increases at a time when residents were stretched thin by the economic downturn.

The time is ripe for us to make crucial investments that will prepare the town for decades to come. While we can kick the can on these investments, our delay will have a real dollar and cents impact on future generations. If we take on these

projects today, we will have the advantage of fixing the interest rate we pay to borrow at a time when rates are near their all-time lows. However, as the economy recovers, property values should increase, but unfortunately so will costs of construction and interest rates. Rates have come up almost an entire percent over the past year, and the upward trend is expected to continue as our economy recovers.

We know the elementary school requires substantial upgrades. Sections of the school were constructed in 1962, 1964 and 1985 with no substantial renovations. We also know our Town's scattered multiple offices should be consolidated from their colonial era homes into one central location - the old middle school. Repurposing the old middle school into a municipal complex will give us a handicap accessible facility where our citizens will have one-stop access to the Town's core services. We will also be able to sell or lease these many town properties, generating additional revenues and taxes to the Town. Standard and

Moodus Reservoir Preservation Group

Our organization was formed to protect and improve the 486 acre lake for the enjoyment of its property owners, town residents and visitors. With the town beach and two state boat launches located here, the lake provides boating, kayaking, swimming, fishing, skating, water skiing and tubing for everyone.

We are now incorporated and are applying for IRS 501(c)3 tax free status. We have established a FaceBook presence at "Moodus Reservoir", and may be contacted by e-mail at Moodus.Reservoir@gmail.com.

Our Weed Control and Water Monitoring Committee is interviewing treatment vendors to develop a plan of treatment based on the 2012 Study of Moodus Reservoir by the Connecticut Agricultural Experiment Station. We have continued with water monitoring on the upper reservoir.



Our Public Relations and Education Committee has distributed information on septic system regulations and boat cleaning recommendations via e-mail and brochures at meetings. Looking Back on One Year in Office

It is hard to believe I have officially been your State Representative for almost 365 days. I am proud of many things that I have done and the promises kept since running for office in 2012.

One of the first things I promised to focus on was Sunrise State Park. While there is still work to be done, it is now a safe place for our residents to visit. Thank you to those 100 citizens who volunteered for the cleanup day and wrote letters of support for the public hearing. We made a difference!

Tax Collector

The second half of Real Estate and Personal Property taxes were due January 1, 2014 and payable through February 3, 2014. Motor Vehicle Supplemental bills were mailed in December and were also due January 1, 2014, payable by February 3, 2014.

Payments can be made in person, by mail or on-line. To pay by mail, send to: Tax Collector, P.O. Box 376, East Haddam, CT 06423-0376. To pay on-line, go to easthaddam.org and click the link "Pay Taxes Online". There is a fee of 2.95% applied to all credit/debit transactions and a flat fee of \$2.95

for all e-checks. These fees go to the processing company, Point & Pay.

You may now look your taxes up online at easthaddam.org. Go to the Tax Collector's page and click "Online Tax Information".

This office is for the collection of taxes only. Any adjustments to your bill must be made by the Assessor. The Assessor can be reached at 860-873-5026 or assessor041@easthaddam.org.

From the Assessor

The Board of Assessment Appeals will meet in March 2014 to hear appeals on real estate assessments. Requests to the Board are due by February 20, 2014. Written requests should include the property owner's name, name and address of the person appealing the assessment, type of property being appealed (real estate or personal property), reason for the appeal, and opinion of value. Although any written request is accepted, forms are available at the East Haddam website: www.easthaddam.org. The mailing address for the Board of Assessment Appeals is P.O. Box K, East Haddam, CT 06423.

The Assessor's Office began taking applications for the Homeowners Credit Program and Additional Veterans Benefits on February 1, 2014. The deadline for applications is May 15, 2014. Applications for the Homeowners' Local Option Program will be accepted from February 1, 2014 until May 15, 2014. The age and proof of income requirements are the same as for the state programs but the income limit is \$50,000 per household.

Disabled veterans must submit proof of disability by March 31, 2014 to receive exemption benefits. Qualifying income for Additional Veterans Benefits is the same as the Elderly and Totally Disabled Tax Relief Program. Applications for the Additional Veterans Benefits will be accepted until October 1, 2014.

Any person or entity starting a new business in town should notify the Assessor's Office so that we can send a personal property declaration in the fall. Personal property assessments are based on the declarant's filing. These assessments can be appealed to the Board of Assessment Appeals. Please note that recent legislation has raised the assessment limit for appealing to the Board from \$500,000 to \$1,000,000. Assessment appeals over \$1,000,000 will be tried in the Superior Court.

Registrar of Voter News

On November 5th, 2013, 1,775 voters of our 5,772 active voters turned out for our Municipal Election. Thus, we had a voter turnout of about 31%; 14% fewer voters than at our last municipal election in 2011. (For the Presidential Election in 2012, we had a voter turnout of 79%!) This lower turnout may have been partially due to the fact that for several positions, there was no challenger to the incumbent, and that included the office of First Selectman.

This past November was also the first time that "Same Day Registration" was in effect. Eligible citizens (over 18 years of age, residents, and U.S. citizens), could register at the Registrar's office, and vote, on Election Day. Here in East Haddam, we had 5 citizens who took advantage of the new opportunity. Their doing so raised the number of active voters on our list from 5,767 to the previously noted 5,772.

Again, we appreciated the time and effort put in by our poll workers: moderator, Joel Ide, and his assistant and greeter, Lou Salicrup; tabulator tenders, Carol Loizeaux and Jane Mazzotta; booth tender, George Drenga; ballot clerk, Forest Anderson; checkers, Nancy Cummings, Louise Pear, Christina Sikorski, and Jovita Cozean. Included also in our thanks are our Deputy Registrars, Laurie Bennett, and Martha Hansen (who was on the ballot, so could not work at the polls election day!); and our Assistant Registrars, Patricia Thomas and Priscilla Hoover.

We thank too, Trish Tarnowski and her important crew of workers who put out signs across the town to remind voters to get to the polls! Nor can we forget the Town Clerk who prepares our ballots, and manages absentee ballots, and the Town Crew who so graciously moves all our equipment each election day. Many workers help to keep democracy alive.

Of all the jobs on Election Day, the one of Moderator, is the most demanding! Although we, as registrars are also certified moderators, we need a good roster of citizens to step up and become certified. To date in East Haddam; Lou Salicrup, Lloyd Neudecker, Joel Ide, Ernest Malavasi, Edward Blaschik, and Ed Gubbins are certified. Mr. Malavasi, Mr. Blaschik and Mr. Gubbins were all on the ballot, and thus, could not work the last election. 9 Town Transit

East Haddam Offers Public Transit Service with 9 Town Transit

East Haddam residents now have greater mobility with new access to a regional transit system. Beginning January 15th, the town of East Haddam began a contract with 9 Town Transit to provide general public Dial-A-Ride service throughout the town.

9 Town Transit, operated by the Estuary Transit District, currently provides Dial-A-Ride service throughout Chester, Clinton, Deep River, Essex, Haddam, Killingworth, Lyme, Old Lyme, Old Saybrook, and Westbrook. Any location within East Haddam and Moodus will now also be included in the new expanded service area.

9 Town Transit will also offer East Haddam residents service to parts of Westchester and Colchester, CT, including the Stop & Shop supermarket. In addition, East Haddam residents may travel to the Middletown Stop & Shop supermarket, Middlesex Hospital, Middlesex Community College and the Saybrook Road area medical offices.

To reserve a trip, customers should call 9 Town Transit at up to two weeks but no less than one day in advance. The fare will be \$3.00 each way, with seniors age 60 and over eligible to ride at a suggested donation of \$1.50. The hours of service are 6:00 a.m. until 6:00 p.m. Monday through Friday. The service is open to the general public with no age restrictions. All vehicles are fully accessible with wheelchair lifts and service is available for any trip purpose.

When calling, be ready to provide the address of where you are going along with the date and time of the trip and return trip. If going to work or an appointment, be sure to tell the reservation agent. The agent will give you a half hour pick-up window in which the bus will arrive. Be ready to board the bus at any time during that window.

Although there is no limit to the purpose of the trip, people going to work, school or other regular appointments may set up a subscription. Once booked, a subscription will repeat regularly unless canceled so there is no need to keep calling to book your trip.

Conservation Commission: A Fall Afternoon in the Woods

It was the last fine fall Saturday in November ... clear blue sky and crisp air ... when twelve warmly dressed and sturdy booted hikers gathered at the gateway to one of East Haddam's newest and most stunning open space properties, the Hatch Lot. Our mission that day was to help complete the goal of marking trails on this property of 238 acres of high wooded land bordered by Mill Road and the Dean easement. When completed, the Hatch Lot will have more than three miles of marked trails ready for hikers, birders, and fresh air lovers. These will connect to a network of trails on adjacent properties as well.

Conservation Commission Chair Rob Smith sorted us into teams, some for clearing with saws and loppers, some for marking trees with paint, and some for sweeping the newly marked trails. We scrambled into two pick-up trucks for the short ride to the property's highest point. Jumping down from the truck, I was brought to a stop by the westward view ... rolling hills as far as the eye could see and, amazingly, a view of BOTH the Connecticut River and Long Island Sound.

It was hard to turn from that sight, but we had work to do, and fall days are short. Off we went with our teams. As a novice, I was assigned to raking the newly marked trail, and my three-person team worked companionably for two hours, stopping now and then to remark on an unusual bush or an especially beautiful evergreen. We could hear the saw sounds of our fellow workers in the distance growing closer as we went, and as the sun grew lower in the sky, we worked our way to a point

where we all converged. Chairman Smith declared it enough for one day. We turned to retrace our steps over a mile and a half of newly cleared and marked trail to the high spot once again. With the sun getting ready to dip behind the western hills, we rolled back down the hill and enjoyed the feeling of accomplishment before going our separate ways.

I share this experience for three reasons. First, you should know that East Haddam has breath-taking open spaces for you to explore and find renewal of spirit. Second, it's important to know that we have to take care of these treasures and make them accessible. And third, and most important, the work of taking care (which we call "stewardship") is easy and a heck of a lot of fun. If I, a person well into her 60s, can take part, almost anyone can.

If you would like a handy trail guide to other East Haddam open spaces, for a small donation, look for displays at Shagbark Pet Room, Gristmill Market, Ballek's Garden Center or the East Haddam Library. (The guide does not contain the Hatch Lot. It's too new.) If you could spend a few hours helping with stewardship, contact Commission member Paul Sienna at Paulsiennajr@gmail.com. We generally hold work party days every two weeks, on second and fourth Saturday afternoons.

Economic Development Corner

The State of Connecticut continues to offer the Small Business Express Program to assist small businesses with financing. The program is administered by the state Department of Economic and Community Development (DECD). Eligible businesses need to have been established in Connecticut for at least 12-months; employ 50 or fewer people, and be in good standing with both local and state taxes. The program has three components; 1) a revolving loan fund; 2) a job creation incentive component; and 3) a matching grant component. A brief summary of each program is below:

1. Revolving Loan Fund (RLF)

- Eligible Uses: Machinery and Equipment purchases (M & E), Construction/Leasehold Improvements, Relocation expenses (in-state), working capital, other
- Terms: 4% max rate, \$10k to \$100k can be borrowed for up to a 10-year term

2. Job Creation Incentive Component (loans)

- Eligible Uses: training, marketing, working capital
- Job Creation forgiveness for job maintenance of 12-months or more
- Terms: \$10k to \$250k can be borrowed at flexible terms

3. Matching Grant Component

- Eligible Uses: Training, M & E, Construction/Leasehold Improvements, Relocation expenses (in-state), working capital, other
- Grant size range from \$10k to \$100k

Master Gardener's Corner

Whether you are a lover of trees, or not, it is vital to know what is happening with Ash trees and what you can do on your own property to save your trees from the Emerald Ash Borer. The following is excerpted from the Quick Reference Guide to Emerald Ash Borer distributed by the University of Connecticut Cooperative Extension System.

The Lifecycle of EAB: Emerald Ash Borer (EAB) is a wood-boring beetle. It feeds exclusively on all species of Ash trees (*Fraxinus* spp.). In Connecticut's forests, there are green, white and black ash trees. The EAB live cycle can take one or two years depending on environmental factors.

1. EAB eggs are laid in the crevices of ash tree bark during the summer, particularly in the crown of the tree where the bark is thinnest.
2. Larvae burrow into the cambial layer under the bark, creating 's'-shaped serpentine galleries as they feed until late fall.
3. Pre-pupal larvae 'jackknife' into a self-created pupal chamber where they spend the winter.
4. In the spring, over a period of two to three weeks, pupae mature into adults.
5. Adults emerge from the tree during May through June, creating a small D-shaped exit hole on the tree. Adults consume leaf tissue before flying, mating and eventually laying eggs. [www.emeraldashborer.info]

Identifying Ash Trees: There are four identifying features of ash trees.

1. Compound leaves comprised of 7 to 11 leaflets depending on specific variety.
2. Twigs are smooth, rigid, grayish in color and resemble 'bones'.
3. Deeply furrowed bark on mature trees.
4. Opposite branching, particularly obvious on newer growth.

Identifying EAB in the Field: Adult EAB may not be the most easily observed indicator of an infestation given their small size and the limited amount of time they are active outside the tree. EAB is more likely to be found either through a formal monitoring process or due to the damage it causes the Ash tree.

1. Splits in tree bark reveal the serpentine galleries created by larvae. Galleries can be found between the outer bark and heartwood in a layer called the 'cambium.'
2. The presence of epicormic branches at the base of the tree, and/or visible decline in the health of the crown (also called crown dieback).
3. Woodpeckers flake off the outermost layer of the bark seeking larvae, exposing lighter inner-bark. Experts believe this is one of the most visible indicators of an EAB infestation.
4. Localized death of the tissue above where larvae have been feeding can cause fissures, cracks, or sloughing off of the bark as the tree continues to grow.

Since its detection in the Detroit, Michigan area in 2002, it has rapidly expanded its range and caused the loss of millions of ash trees from the Midwest to New York and south to Tennessee. The EAB was detected in CT on July 16, 2012 in New Haven County and now it's being found throughout all of CT and New England. You need to know the facts and what you can do to help prevent the spread of EAB. Just imagine East Haddam with thousands of dead Ash Trees! Every new year brings hope, excitement, challenges and opportunities. Hopefully 2014 will also bring renewed fortitude as the district continues to implement a number of state initiatives designed to improve student learning. We are fortunate to have a wealth of talented and dedicated teachers and administrators working to ensure that every student in East Haddam receives a high quality education.

This year we are preparing to administer the new state standardized assessment: Smarter Balanced Assessment Consortium (SBAC). SBAC is designed to assess student progress towards the Common Core State Standards, and will be replacing the Connecticut Mastery Test (CMT) and the Connecticut Academic Performance Test (CAPT) this spring. There are eight overall Claims – 4 English Language Arts and 4 Math – that will be assessed on the new test:

- Students can read closely and analytically to comprehend a range of increasingly complex literary and informational texts.
- Students can produce effective and well-grounded writing for a range of purposes and audiences.
- Students can employ effective speaking and listening skills for a range of purposes and audiences.
- Students can engage in research and inquiry to investigate topics, and to analyze, integrate, and present information.
- Students can explain and apply mathematical concepts and interpret and carry out mathematical procedures with precision and fluency.
- Students can solve a range of complex well-posed problems in pure and applied mathematics, making productive use of knowledge and problem solving strategies.
- Students can clearly and precisely construct viable arguments to support their own reasoning and to critique the reasoning of others
- Students can analyze complex, real-world scenarios and can construct and use mathematical models to interpret and solve problems.

Land Trust Partners with New Club at Hale-Ray Middle School

The Environmental Club, a new club for 7th and 8th grade students, works in collaboration with the East Haddam Land Trust to build, maintain and study a network of hiking trails on the property of the Nathan Hale-Ray Middle School.

During their monthly meetings, the club learns from members of the Land Trust about the process of trail construction and about native plants and wildlife. Students have cleared approximately 75% of their first trail, which includes the construction of several 'leak-offs' that help to divert water from the trail and thereby prevent erosion. Once completed, the initial trail will provide access to a fresh-water stream, which will be utilized by science teachers in their study of fresh water ecosystems and related topics.

In the winter months, students will be guided through several projects to support the use of the trail as a learning tool. For example, students will write short descriptions and identifying features of the plants that grow along the trail. Students will also be involved in the planning and installation of homes for native bird life. As the weather warms and trail construction resumes,

students will also create a map of the trail, which will be available to teachers, hikers and members of the community.

Noah Ventola, with assistance and guidance from Rob Smith of East Haddam's Land Trust, started the club as part of his work as an administrative intern at the Middle School. The collaborative project was developed to fulfill one requirement of Southern Connecticut State University's Sixth-Year degree program. Danielle Michaud, an eighth grade Language Arts teacher at the middle school, is the Club's faculty advisor.

If interested in trail construction and maintenance, the East Haddam Land Trust is looking for volunteers to help construct trails throughout East Haddam's open spaces. The group meets from 1-4 every other Saturday at an open space site to clear trails and maintain property boundaries. 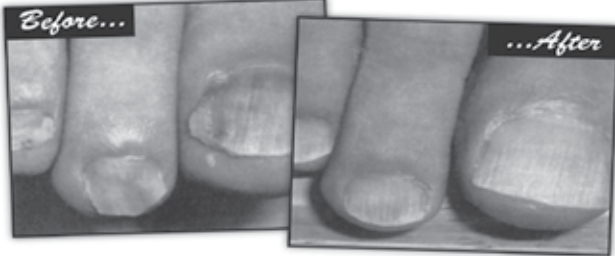

Land Trust Launches Fundraising Campaign



In 2013 East Haddam Land Trust (EHLT) invested in preserving Hidden Valley Farm along the Moodus River and in two East Haddam Open Space parcels - the woodland and miles-beyond overlook of Hatch Lot and the Roaring Brook Preserve. But these investments significantly depleted Land Trust coffers, leading EHLT to initiate major fundraising efforts.

EHLT is an extremely efficient organization of dedicated volunteers (visit www.ehlt.org to see all of 2013's accomplishments). The average administrative expense over the last five

years totaled less than 0.4% of EHLT's assets. Since 1979 EHLT has directly preserved nearly 350 acres through land purchases and conservation easements. Working to protect the rural character of East Haddam, EHLT has partnered with local, state and national organizations in protecting other environmentally and/or historically critical lands in watersheds of the Eightmile, Moodus and Salmon Rivers, Roaring and Succor Brooks, Chapman Pond, and Salmon Cove. East Haddam's unique landscape means EHLT is able to tap into valuable state and national funding aimed at protecting the very land that comprises our Town - the watersheds feeding the Connecticut River, the first National Blueway in America and one of The Nature Conservancy's Last Great Places, and the nationally designated Wild and Scenic Eightmile River Watershed.

Oh, My Aching Back!

With the Winter upon us and shoveling snow part of our routine, you may be experiencing more aches and pains than usual. In part those new sensations are due to new positions your body is in as well as physically doing a different activity than what you are used to doing. Add to that any prior tightness you may have had and your body is letting you know it's not a happy camper right now.

There can be several reasons why you are having this issue. One reason may be that your pain is being caused by a bone being out of alignment and you need a chiropractic adjustment. Another reason may be that your muscles are tight and causing your current pain.

In the case of upper back pain, those issues are usually caused by the front of your body right below your clavicle in the pectoralis muscles. When tight, they cause you to round your shoulders and over-extend your upper back making your neck and upper back hurt. By loosening the muscles in the front, and strengthening the area between your shoulder blades, the muscles go back in place and you usually no longer have upper back pain.

If you have pain in the lower back, there are 2 areas that

I check. One is the sacral tuberosus ligament that is between the tailbone and the 'sits' bone. If tight, it causes your hip to be higher on that side which results in you walking unevenly. Joggers and power walkers can have this as an issue.

The other area is the iliopsoas muscles that are located in the front area near each hip. It is actually 2 muscles called the iliacus and the psoas. One muscle attaches to the front of your spinal column and the other is attached to the hip and meet near your hip and go down into your leg. If tight, your hips tilt forward putting undue tension in your low back. When this muscle is tight, usually your calves and thighs are tight as well since your body will try to compensate for your body being tilted. These issues can be caused by prolonged sitting, cycling, etc. Once that area is released, the person stands upright and their low back usually no longer bothers them.

If needed, please see your doctor to determine if any tests, physical therapy, etc are needed for your specific issue.

will join new members Michael Werner, Marc Piscioti and Shawn Conroy.

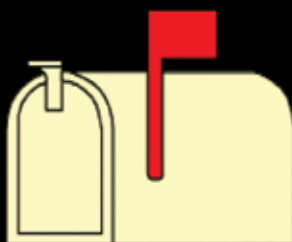
