First Selectman's Corner

I am happy to report that our 2015-2016 budget was approved at referendum on May 5, 2015. The Boards of Selectmen, Finance and Education worked together to establish a budget that:

- Exhibits the highest level of fiscal management.
- Ensures that we maintain important town services, provide a great education for our children and is mindful of the tax impact on our citizens.
- Plans and saves for future capital projects including the four major projects approved at referendum on June 16, 2015: renovation of the former school into a new municipal complex, improvements to the elementary school, two firehouses and the town-wide emergency radio and communications system.
- Ensures no reliance on our savings to help balance the budget.

Our strong long range planning for the funding of four projects outlined above has been made possible due to the cooperative efforts of the building advisory groups, the Boards of Finance, Education and Selectmen and town employees. These projects will open up the future development of our most picturesque historic village on the Connecticut River. We will be able to create a premier anchor for tourism in the Connecticut Lower River Valley and open up our village for commercial grand list growth, resulting in an increase to our tax base. We will be brushing off and reviewing the old plans for developing the East Haddam Village Town Office site, and selecting the best elements as the basis for forging a vital community. To do this, we plan to do the following:

• Create focus groups from our stakeholders to develop and vet ideas, including hosting design charrettes.

• Work collaboratively

with the Goodspeed Opera House Foundation, and incorporate their goals, objectives and plans with the Town's goals, objectives and plans.

- Reach across the river to our neighbors in Haddam with the goal of including Tylerville in our planning, and create a synergy between our communities.
- Review our mix of land uses and encourage a blend of retail, commercial and residential uses to support the village area.
- The Village Revitalization Commission, Land Use Commissions, Historic District Commission and the Economic Development Commission will be key in the planning and coordination.



The Maps are Here!


Your Conservation Commission's mission is not only to steward our town's open spaces, but just as importantly to make it easy for you to experience them. Woodland paths, beautiful vistas, picnic opportunities, and hiking galore on over 30 miles of marked trails await you right here in East Haddam. And now we are very pleased to tell you that we have the maps that will make your outdoor experience safe and convenient! With thanks for the hard work of member Marilyn Gleeson, the Commission has completed a year-long process of GPS mapping trails on 14 parcels and printing individual maps for each. (Special thanks to FFA for doing the mapping of the Nichols Property.) These maps include directions to the trailheads, a history of the property, and tips about what to expect on each parcel.

You can select the maps of your choice currently at four centralized locations in town: Balleks Garden Center, the Town Offices, Gillette Castle State Park Visitors Center, and Nathan Hale Pharmacy. Just look for the display and pick the maps that interest you.

Maps will also be available soon at trailhead kiosks at the Hatch Lot and Rose Farms parcels, and by mid-summer, maps will be available in receptacles near the entrance to most other hikable parcels as well.

Our long-term plan is to make these maps available on line so that you can print them out at home whenever the mood strikes. The Conservation Commission's page of the Town's of East Haddam's website should be ready soon with a link to each map. You may also like to check out the website: Mytowntrails.com to find satellite maps of our 14 parcels too.

Please take advantage of these handy maps. We hope they will open the door to the wonderful variety of outdoor experiences that await you on your town's open space.

East Haddam Agriculture Commission

Many of you may not be aware that East Haddam has an agriculture commission and those that are aware of our existence may not know much else about us. So here is the who, what, why, how and when, explained in an easy-to-read "AgComm" primer.

Why We're Here: On July 13th, 2010, First Selectman Mark Walter created the Agriculture Commission BECAUSE:

- Agriculture has always been important to the character of East Haddam;
- Family farms (and the rural landscape they represent) are being lost to residential development;
- Farms provide local revenue and jobs, create recreational and tourism opportunities, and offer ecological and environmental benefits.

What We Do: We are an advisory board with a mission to:

- Preserve, protect and promote our remaining farms;
- Encourage new agricultural enterprises, contributing to our rural character while insuring a local source of food for the future.

How We Do It: As a group we are sworn to act as an advocate for local agriculture by:

- Being a liaison between non-profit/civic organizations, municipal entities and local farmers;
- Recommending changes in local laws and practices;
- Supporting vocational education and regional agriculture programs;

- Serving as a resource for information, advice and guidance for residents and town entities concerning resolution of agriculture related issues, conflicts and the impact of proposed policies on farms;
- Identifying innovative opportunities for farming in East Haddam;
- Promoting opportunities for the community to support and value farming;
- Working to secure the land base necessary for future agricultural uses.

Who We Are: The Agricultural Commission consists of 5 regular members and 3 alternate members, appointed by the Board of Selectmen.

We are:

- Of varied backgrounds and represent all interests in the promotion, protection and regulation of agriculture;
- Residents of East Haddam who love this town and want to ensure its prosperity, while retaining its character;
- Happy to be a part of this commission, dedicated to our charter, and proud to serve our town.

When We Meet: The Agriculture Commission meets regularly on the first Monday of the month. Meeting information, agendas and minutes are posted on the municipal website.

From the Assessor

The Assessor's office began accepting applications for the Elderly and Totally Disabled Renters Rebate Program on April 1, 2015. Applicant's total income must not exceed \$34,600 for a single person, \$42,200 for a couple (joint income), including Social Security and Medicare. Applicants must be 65 or older or totally disabled and bring all income, rent, and utility information from 2014. The deadline for filing is October 1, 2015.

Residents whose motor vehicles have been sold, stolen, totaled, or who have moved out-of-state may be eligible for a pro-ration of their car taxes.

Two forms of proof are necessary to pro-rate or remove a vehicle from the grand list. Residents must bring a copy of the plate receipt issued by the Department of Motor Vehicles at the time of cancellation of registration, and a copy of one of the following; bill of sale, transfer of title, receipt from junkyard, notification of total loss, trade-in papers, or some other document showing the date on which the vehicle was disposed.

The Assessor's office has its own web page on the town website (easthaddam.org). Included is information on real estate, personal property, and motor vehicle assessments; property tax relief for seniors, veterans, and the disabled; renters' rebate; information on revaluation; access to applications and forms pertaining to the Assessor's office.

From Your Economic Development Coordinator: Peter Simmons

It has been a very busy Spring. The EDC reviewed the Town Business Incentive Program and found that it needed some rework to make it a more effective tool for the community. The principle change to the ordinance is how we calculate the tax benefit offered to the business. The former calculation did not offer enough of an incentive for any business comparing a move to East Haddam or any other town. This change will help make East Haddam more competitive with our neighboring communities. The revamped ordinance was approved by the EDC, Board of Selectmen and Board of Finance and at a Town meeting on June 30th.

East Haddam Libraries

Folks are always asking me questions about our local libraries. Since 2/3 of East Haddam citizens have library cards, there are probably many of you with similar questions who just haven't had the opportunity to ask. With that in mind, I'd like to take this opportunity to answer some Frequently Asked Questions about the East Haddam Library System.

Frequently Asked Questions about the East Haddam Library System:

What are the advantages of having two libraries?

The biggest advantage is that having two libraries means having two library collections. The libraries hold over 45,000 materials including books, movies, and audio books, which is much more than either location could hold on its own.

In addition, each branch of the East Haddam Library System has its specialties. For instance:

EHFPL Specialties: Movies, TV Shows, Blu-Ray, Teen Fiction, Classic Literature, Graphic Novels/Manga, Anime, Books on CD, Magazines, Video Games, and Large Print

Rathbun Specialties: Adult Fiction, Adult Mysteries, Romance Novels, Biographies, Historical Collection, Art Books, Award Winning Films, Independent Films, BBC Productions, Music CDs, and Local History

Each library has something for everyone, and you might find that you prefer one library's collection over the other (even if it's not listed as a specialty). The reason many people choose to visit both libraries is because of the variety in materials, and the different aspects of local culture that each branch embraces.

Can I use my library card at either library?

Yes! You can use your card at EHFPL or Rathbun. Both Libraries are part of the LION Consortium – a collection of 28 Libraries who share a common catalog. If you access our catalog via our website – www.EastHaddamLibrarySystem.org, you can renew and reserve books online from any LION library and choose where to pick them up. Your card also gives you access to downloadable eBooks, audio books, and magazines.

What other ways do the libraries complement each other?

EHFPL & Rathbun have spent the last few years streamlining their services. Materials can be checked-in or renewed at either location. If the library you're at doesn't have the item you're looking for, the librarian can check to see if the other branch has a copy available. If so, they can place a hold on the item and you can go pick it up across town or wait until the next day to pick it up at either location.



Each map provides directions to and a brief description of the property, plus specific features such as history, elevation, trail length and difficulty, wildlife information and permitted activities.

19th Annual Venture Smith Day Festivities To Be Held On Saturday, September 12th From 1:00 – 4:00 p.m.

The 19th annual Venture Smith Day Festivities will be held in the cemetery at the First Church of Christ, 499 Town Street (RT. 151), East Haddam on Saturday, September 12 from 1:00 to 4:00 p.m. as part of the Connecticut Freedom Trail events. Son of an African king, Venture Smith became the first black man to document his capture from Africa and life as an American slave and successful black freeman in Connecticut. Adults and children who are interested in learning more about Connecticut history in the 1700 and 1800s are encouraged to attend. Please bring lawn chairs or blanket. In case of inclement weather the celebration will move into the parish house of First Church.

Guest speakers include noted author Anne Farrow who will speak about her most recent publication, *The Logbooks: Connecticut's Slave Ships and Human Memory.* Farrow's book is about a sailing ship owned by an affluent Connecticut merchant who sailed from New London to Bence Island in Sierra Leone, West Africa, to acquire fresh water and slaves. Dr. Karl P. Stofko, East Haddam Municipal Historian, will discuss his recent research findings regarding Venture Smith. Descendants of Venture Smith will also talk about their trip to Africa.

Venture Smith's family genealogy and artifacts and crafts from Ghana and other regions of Africa will be on display. A town proclamation will be presented and a wreath laying ceremony by the descendants of Venture Smith and the annual Venture family



reunion photograph will take place in the cemetery by Venture's grave. There will be plenty of time to renew old friendships, talk with speakers, and Venture's descendants and enjoy light refreshments. Questions please call (860) 873-9375. A Brief Biography of Venture Smith

Born around 1729, Venture Smith's African birth name was Broteer, and he was the eldest son of King Saungm Furro of the tribe of Dukandarra in Guinea, West Africa. He was captured about 1736 when he was seven years old and was sold for "4 gallons of rum and some calico" at Anamabo on Africa's Gold Coast to Robinson Mumford, the steward of a Rhode Island slave ship. Broteer was renamed Venture because he was purchased by Mumford's own private venture. Venture grew up as a slave on Fishers Island, New York, which was being leased by the Mumford family at that time.



Susi (Henry) Ryan is an 8th generation descendant of Venture Smith.

Around 1750 he married Meg, another Mumford slave, and they had four children. After a failed escape attempt in 1754, Venture was sold to Thomas Stanton of Stonington Point, Connecticut. In 1760, he was purchased for the last time by Oliver Smith, of Stonington. Smith allowed Venture to purchase his freedom in 1765 and in return Venture took the name Smith as his surname. Venture then lived and worked on Long Island to raise money to purchase the freedom of his wife and children. During these years he cut wood, farmed, fished, and spent seven months on a whaling voyage. In 1774, Venture sold all his land on Long Island and in Stonington and moved his family to East Haddam. He then began purchasing land on Haddam Neck along the Salmon River Cove from Abel Bingham and others. His farm grew into 134 acres with three houses; twenty boats, canoes and sailing vessels; two fishing businesses and a commercial orchard. His entrepreneurial ventures included river trafficking, lumberjacking, carpentry and farming. All this he accomplished without the ability to either read or write.

In 1798, Venture dictated his autobiography to teacher Elisha Niles, which was then published in pamphlet form by Charles Holt, editor of the New London Bee. It has been reprinted many times. It is the only slave narrative of the 18th century that recounts life in Africa. His life story has been an inspiration to many over the years. Venture died on September 19, 1805, a highly respected man by all in the Haddams. He was survived by his wife, two sons, Cuff and Solomon, and several grandchildren. Several of his descendants still live in Connecticut.



Absentee Ballots

For Municipal Election

An elector may vote by absentee ballot due to:

- (1) the elector's absence from their town for all of the hours of voting;
- (2) illness or physical disability;
- (3) active service in the US armed forces;
- (4) religious tenets forbid secular activity on Election Day; or
- (5) service as a polling place official in a town other than their own.

Beginning October 5th absentee ballots are available from the Office of the Town Clerk for the November 3rd Municipal Election. Absentee balloting is a two step process. The ballot may not be issued until an application for the ballot has been received. Applications may be filed in advance of the ballot becoming available.

To obtain the application for an absentee ballot, call 860-873-5027 or come into the Town Clerk's Office. Forms may also be downloaded from the town's website www.easthaddam.org (elections under Town Clerk) or www.sots.ct.gov (elections & voting, voter resources, absentee ballot and procedures, application for ballot). The absentee ballot application with an original signature must be on file in order for a ballot to be counted.

Tax Collector

After the budget passed at referendum on May 5, 2015, the Mill Rate for the 2014 Grand List was set at 28.68 (an increase of .78 mills). Tax bills for the 2014 Grand List were mailed on June 30, 2015 and were due on July 1, 2015 payable by August 3, 2015 with no interest or penalty. If you recently purchased property and did not receive a tax bill, please contact the Tax Office immediately.

Tax payments may be made in person, by mail or on-line. There is a secure lock box in the front alcove, which is available 24 hours. Payments may be dropped there after hours. If you choose to pay your taxes on-line, you may do so by going to easthaddam. org and clicking the "PAY TAXES ONLINE" button. There is a transaction fee of 2.95% on all credit/debit payments and a \$2.95 for e-checks. This fee applies to both online and in the office payments.



Fifth Grade Medieval Wax Museum

Friday, May 22 was not your typical day at Nathan Hale-Ray Middle school. At 8:30 a.m. the doors to the gym were opened and countless medieval characters took their places under buildings, among the mills, and inside the castle. Friday, May 22 was Medieval Day!



This summer, I-Park (i-park.org) will open its doors to the public for two special programs, its Environmental Art Biennale and Composers + Musicians Collaborative Residency.

Established in East Haddam in 2001, I-Park is a secluded retreat for artists to focus, undisturbed, on their individual, creative pursuits. Traversed by the pristine Eightmile River, I-Park spans 450 protected acres and borders the Devil's Hopyard State Park. The sprawling grounds and free form/adaptive programming encourage artists-in-residence to embrace experimentation and a sense of limitless creative potential.

I-Park's format involves a series of 4-week, fully-funded residency sessions, each with 6 individuals from various creative disciplines working on their personal projects. In contrast, the Environmental Art program entails a 3-week residency with an international group of 12 highly credentialed artists – all working in the field of site-responsive environmental art. In addition to sculptural installations, there will be examples of sound and performance art. The program culminates, on September 20, in a free exhibition of the works developed during the residency.

An evening fundraiser on September 19 will feature an exclusive preview walk of the environmental art trail, an engaging dinner with the artists and some other surprises. The I-Park Foundation is a 501(c)(3) non-profit corporation. The Environmental Art Biennale has been partially funded by the National Endowment for the Arts.

The Composers + Musicians Collaborative Residency is an experimental program that will bring together 6 performers from a New York-based ensemble and 6 composers. The idea is to enrich the traditional creative process involved in bringing a new composition from concept to concert. The program will encourage collaborative exchanges of ideas and inspiration, entail numerous 'readings' of the new works-in-progress and result in a series of 3 concerts, including one at St. Stephen's Church in East Haddam



on August 23 and another later in the day at I-Park.




