


First Selectwoman's Corner

Happy Spring! -The past 3 months have been very busy and I can't believe that the time has gone by so quickly. They are many exciting things happening in Haddam and I want to update you on just a few of them.

The Board of Selectmen has presented the town budget to the Board of Finance and it is being reviewed by the BOF, to be presented at the May 4th, public hearing. The grand list is down this year due to revaluation however we are working diligently to provide services and capital projects that are necessary for the town to grow and help reduce further tax burdens in the future. I have met with Superintendent of Schools, Howard Thiery, a number of times to discuss the school budget impact on our town. I have suggested a committee be set up so that we can look at how the Town of Haddam, Killingworth and RSD17 can work together and all parties are agreeable on the forefront.

On February 4th a joint Economic Development meeting was held with East Haddam at the Gelston House and was very well attended by local businesses and by Senator Art Linares. The focus of the meeting was on tourism for "the Haddam's". A spring weekend celebration will be held by "the Haddam's" on April 30th and May 1st, many of the local businesses will have special offers and we will be hosting a kite flying contest at Haddam Meadows, along with other events. I have been actively meeting with DEEP and DPH to discuss resolutions to the water issue in Tylerville on a regular basis and lobbying up at the capitol during this short session and have had lengthy conversations with both Rep. Phil Miller and Sen. Art Linares. I have requested that letters be sent to both of them to show support for having this issue corrected.

State Senator Art Linares have both been in Haddam with forums educating on heroin and opioids in our community. Haddam has had overdoses in the last month and this is an issue that we need to talk about and educate the public. Many of these forums are being held around the state and it was great to see that our Youth and Family Services took part in both of these local forums and has information on this.

We have come up with some solutions on road projects, work will be started on this in 2016, we are finalizing the steps of the process and will be providing more information on this in the **Continued on page 3**



near future and a few locations have been identified for a possible cell phone tower site on the 154 corridor.

A building committee has been formed to work on the Jail and Scovil Hoe Buildings and funds have been made available for a feasibility study to be done on both properties. A meeting was held at the town hall on March 1st with Deputy Commissioner Tim Sullivan from DECD on this on how we can move forward with these projects.

We also have had two new hires to the town, one is Gary Vivian who was hired after Fern Tremblay retired and the other is Eleanor Farrell, an attorney who was appointed as Municipal Agent. Her office will be with Public Health in the Jail Annex Building. Welcome to both of them!

DOG LICENSE

Dog License renewal is due in June. Please come in and register your dog so that you have the current tag. Our Animal Control Officer will be contacting you, if you are delinquent.

Fees: A neutered or spayed dog \$8.00 -An unneutered or unspayed dog \$19.00 Kennel License is \$51.00 - Beginning July 1, a penalty fee will be charged for every month a resident is late in registering a dog. Licenses can be mailed once proof of current rabies vaccination and a spaying/ neutered certificate are mailed to the Town Clerk at 30 Field Park Drive, Haddam, CT 06438, along with your fee, and a self-addressed stamped envelope. If you no longer have your dog, please let us know so that we may update our records. If you have any questions or concerns regarding licensing your dog(s) please call or email our office.

TRANSFER STATION

The Transfer Station is located on Route 154, just north of the Haddam Meadows State Park. If you do not have a private trash collection service, trash and recyclables should be brought separated to the Transfer Station. To assure that only Haddam residents use the Transfer Station, a current Haddam sticker must be displayed in order to use the facility. Stickers are good for the fiscal year (July through June) and may be purchased for a \$50 fee from the Town Clerk at the Town Office building. The operators of the Transfer Station are licensed by the State and will assist residents to assure compliance with the recycling law.

Hours: Wednesday, 8:00am - 3:45pm, Saturday, 8:00am - 3:45pm, Sunday, 8:00am- 11:45am.

All Transfer Station permits expire July 1st. To insure that there is a clear understanding of the rules, please read below:

Permit must be clearly displayed and adhered to the driver's side window shield.

Registration must be written on the permit itself.

Any vehicles without a current permit or without a sticker on vehicle will not be allowed to leave its contents at the Transfer Station.

Loose permit stickers will be required to be applied to the vehicle before dumping or vehicle will be turned away.

SPORTSMEN

2016 Sports Licenses are available. Additional information regarding regulations, permits, conservation education/firearms safety courses are available on line at: http//www.ct.gov/dep DEEP reminds anglers age 65 and older that the free resident "lifetime" inland fishing, hunting and trapping licenses for individuals age 65 and older became "annual" licenses effective October 1, 2009.

All "age 65 and older" free inland fishing, hunting and trapping licenses obtained since October 1, 2009 must now be renewed annually. Additionally, all "age 65 and older" free marine fishing licenses must be renewed annually.


Holders of age 65 and older "lifetime" Connecticut inland fishing licenses obtained prior to October 1, 2009 are not required to reregister for a new license. However, should one lose this "lifetime" license, they will need to obtain a free replacement by accessing the licensing system from their home computer, or by visiting a town hall, DEEP office or other anticipating vendor.

All individuals with "lifetime" hunting or combination hunting & fishing licenses will need to register themselves in the Automated Licensing System to obtain the appropriate permits and tags along with their unique Conservation ID#.

In subsequent license years, this Conservation ID# will be re-used and the free hunting license will need to be selected annually prior to obtaining permits and tags.

News from the Assessor's Office

ASSESSOR'S OFFICE CLOSING

The Assessor's Office will be closed for the annual Assessor's School at UCONN from June 6, 2016 through June 10, 2016.

SENIOR CORNER - Important News and Application Deadlines

• State of Connecticut Elderly Homeowner's (Circuit Breaker) + Town of Haddam Elderly and Disabled Tax Relief Program The filing period for these programs is February 1, 2016 to May 15, 2016. Persons who file must be 65 years of age as of 12/31/2015 or totally disabled.

• Additional Veteran's Exemption – The filing period for Additional Veteran's exemptions is February 1, 2016 to October 1, 2016.

Proof of income is required when filing for the above programs. Income includes all taxable, non-taxable income as well as social security income.

Disabled Veterans Please Note: When a disabled veteran

receiving an exemption **reaches the age of 65+** there is an increase in the amount of the exemption regardless of the percent of disability, even if the rating is only 10%. Please contact the Assessor's Office if you have been receiving a veteran's disability exemption and are age 65 or older.

MOTOR VEHICLE INFORMATION

Did you sell or dispose of a Motor Vehicle?
Are you going to sell or dispose of a Motor Vehicle?

If the answer is **YES** you must return or cancel your registration plates with the Department of Motor Vehicle (DMV) and obtain a plate receipt that you will need to provide to the Assessor's Office **along with** proof of what happened to that vehicle. (See **Motor Vehicle –Standard Forms of Proof** below to see a list of accepted documents.) This will allow us to either remove or prorate the motor vehicle. Then when you receive your bill in July it will be from October 1st to the month of disposal.

If you sold or disposed of a motor vehicle but transferred the plates to a new vehicle then it will be reflected in the billing and no action is necessary on your part.

For example: You owned a 2010 Ford F150 on October 1, 2015 and sold that vehicle on December 21, 2015 and the plates were transferred to a 2014 Ford F250, you will get a bill for the 2010 F150 in July 2016 and you must pay that bill. You will receive a Supplemental bill for the 2014 F150 in January (2017) that will give you a credit for what you paid on the 2010 vehicle in July 2016.

Motor Vehicle - Standard Forms of Proof

TWO FORMS OF PROOF ARE REQUIRED TO REMOVE OR PRORATE A VEHICLE:

PLATE RECEIPT from DMV indicating that the registration has been CANCELLED, LOST OR STOLEN.

2. IN ADDITION TO # 1, ONE OF THE FOLLOWING PROOFS:

A copy of the Bill of Sale - The bill of sale is now on the bottom of the vehicle owner's registration form and transfer information must be recorded on the back of the registration form before being submitted to DMV – therefore the seller's obligation is to provide a copy of the signed registration form along with a copy of the plate receipt to the Assessor.

A copy of the Transfer of Title - The seller must provide the assessor with a copy of the signed title and a copy of the plate receipt.

A copy of the new owner's registration – A copy of the registration from the new owner along with a copy of the plate receipt.

Out of state registration – Proof of residency and a copy of registration showing the date the vehicle was registered outside the state of Connecticut along with the a copy of the plate receipt.

Stolen or Totaled vehicle – A statement from the insurance company indicating that the vehicle was stolen and NOT RECOVERED or totaled or a copy of the accident report. If the owner did not return the plates then he/she must file a lost or stolen plate form with the DMV and provide us with a copy of the plate receipt.

Junked vehicle – A receipt from junkyard and a copy of the plate receipt.

Trade-in vehicle – A copy of the purchase agreement identifying the trade-in vehicle and a copy of the plate receipt.

Donated vehicle - A statement from the organization showing the vehicle identification number (VIN) and a copy of the plate receipt.

If you move you must, by law, report your change of address to the DMV. You must be sure that the tax town code is changed. This will ensure that your vehicles will be included on the new tax town's tax list. It is important that when you change your address with the DMV that you change BOTH your driver's license AND your motor vehicle registration.

If you receive a tax bill for a vehicle you no longer have in your possession do not ignore it. Please call our office at 860-345-8531 with any questions.

REPORTING ADDRESS CHANGES IS CRUCIAL TO TAXPAYERS!!!

It is imperative that you report any change of mailing address to the Assessor's office. The mailing address on the Assessor's records is what is used for all tax bills and other correspondence such as assessment information, assessment appeals information, etc. Not only is this information used by the tax collector but it is used by the land use office, building ...department, selectman's office and other departments.

We have come across many circumstances where the mailing address on record has been incorrect. These incorrect addresses result in interest penalties and other charges imposed by the Tax Collector's Office due to the claim that no tax bill was received. Non-receipt of a tax bill does not negate your liability to pay the bill including any interest or penalties. Therefore, we are trying to spare our residents any problems which may arise from an incorrect mailing address.

Remember, if you move, your mail is only forwarded by the post office for a certain amount of time. In some cases, because the tax bills aren't generated until the following July, your forwarding address has expired leaving the Tax Collector with no current address. According to Connecticut General State Statute we are only obligated to send it to the latest known address. Unfortunately, an incorrect address does not eliminate your liability to pay the bill, including all interest and penalties.

If you elect to receive your mail via a post office box, please note that we are unable to access that information through the post office or any other means, so PLEASE inform our office immediately of any change of that type.

Another important point regarding mailing addresses is that if your taxes are paid by your mortgage company we may not have your current mailing address because the bill is forwarded to them for the life of the mortgage. While this may not affect your tax bill during the mortgage period once the mortgage is paid off or ended we may not have your proper address if we are not notified of any change. In addition, it will affect any other correspondence directed to you.

If you are unsure of your current mailing address, you may call the Assessor's Office to verify the address that we have on file.




