The Department of Senior & Social Services consists of two offices; the Social Services Office, designed to assist the general public and the Senior Services Office & Senior Center designed to assist the elderly population.

The Senior Center is located at 12 Maple Avenue, Uncasville and offers a wide range of services. Senior Services provides our elderly with information and assistance to relevant / pertinent issues. The primary function of the Senior Services Department is to provide assistance, services, referrals, and information to our elderly population and their families, as well as planning, administering, organizing, and supervising

all programs and services within the Center. We have a wonderful, extremely busy Senior Center with a great deal to offer our Montville seniors!

The Social Services Office is located in the Town Hall parking lot (behind old town hall, to the side / in front of new one). The Social Services building is separate from the Town Hall and affords our residents the privacy and confidentially deserved and needed to receive services and assistance with compassion in a comfortable setting. The primary function of the Social Services Office is to provide immediate assistance and crisis intervention for Montville residents. We have seen a tremendous increase in the amount of residents needing our services. All of our assistance programs have proved extremely beneficial during this difficult time. Our Social Services Building houses our Food Bank, Hygiene Bank, and seasonal Clothing Bank.

Soap, shampoo, toothpaste, toilet tissue are just a few of the items we have regularly in stock to help our needy individuals and families in town. Our Hygiene Bank is located in the Social Services Building - walkins are welcome.

Doctor appointments, hospital tests & screenings, therapy, pharmacies, dentists, etc. Any medical related appointment. This program is supported by the Town of Montville and the Eastern Connecticut Area Agency on Aging with Title III funds made available under the Older Americans Act. MedRIDES II is the same type of medical transportation program though it is a joint effort between the Town of Montville and the City of Norwich. Funds are provided by the State of Connecticut. Driver is located out of the Montville Senior Center. Appointments need to be made by calling the Norwich Senior Center at 860-889-5960.

#### **HEALTH CLINIC**

We offer a Health Clinic at the Senior Center on Tuesdays from 9:00 - 11:00 a.m. We have a visiting nurse come to the Center to perform blood pressure, blood sugar, and anemia screenings every week. All services at the Clinic are FREE - donation box is available for contributions. Call Kathie @ 860-848-0422 for details.

#### **EQUIPMENT PROGRAM**

The Department of Senior and Social Services has medical equipment (i.e. wheel chairs, walkers, shower seats, commodes, etc.) available for our Montville residents on a loan basis. The equipment can be borrowed for any length of time and returned whenever finished. FREE program, a release form must be signed. Call @ 860-848-0422 for details.

#### **PODIATRIST**

We have a wonderful Podiatrist, Dr. Thomas Walter, come to our Center once a month on Wednesday to perform routine foot care. Not a service normally covered by Medicare unless you are a Diabetic, Dr. Walter will perform routine foot care for a cost less than a regular office visit. This Program is free to Montville seniors. Funding for the program is provided by Title III funds made available through the Area Agency on Aging and the Town of Montville. Call Kathie for details and date of next visit.

#### MASSAGE THERAPY

Massage Therapy offers many health benefits (relief from arthritis, circulation, aids in digestion, etc.) Appts are free to Montville seniors. ## Prescription Drug Discount Program

The Montville Implemented Free Prescription Drug Discount Program is offered by the Connecticut Conference of Municipalities for residents of its member towns and cities.

The Town of Montville through its association with the Connecticut Conference of Municipalities (CCM), the statewide association of towns and cities, is now providing a new prescription discount card that will provide uninsured and underinsured residents steep savings on prescription medicines.

Montville is a member of CCM and this new program is only available to CCM member-communities. This prescription discount card will provide immediate fiscal relief at the pharmacy counter for uninsured and underinsured residents and offers the following features and benefits:

- Anyone can participate regardless of age or income;
- All prescription medications are covered including pet prescriptions that can be filled at a pharmacy;

- There is no cost to the municipality or to participating residents;
  - Cost savings average 45%;
- There are over 63,000 participating pharmacies nationwide, including CVS, Rite-Aid, Walgreens, Wal-Mart, Stop and Shop, and Big Y, and many independent pharmacies;
- Discounts are also offered on other medical services including vision, hearing and Lasik services.

Cards are available in Town Hall, at local pharmacies or by visiting www.CTRxDiscountCard.com, and selecting Montville from the drop-down menu. Cards may be used by all town residents regardless of age, income or existing health coverage. There are no enrollment forms, membership fees, restrictions or limits on frequency of use for residents. Cardholders and their family members are encouraged to use the cards any time their prescriptions are not covered by insurance.

\*Due to the increased interest in our After School Program, we have a waiting list in place. The ASP is a fee based program. There will be a \$100 registration fee assessed each year your child is in the program. A \$25 non-refundable deposit is due at the time of registration in the program. The remainder of the balance is due 90 days from the original registration date. Parents with more than one child in the ASP will adhere to a tiered payment plan: 1st child-\$100, 2nd child- \$75, 3rd child-\$50, 4th child- \$25. (Parents who have a child/children placed on the waiting list will not be required to pay the ASP fee until a spot opens in the After School Program.) Montville ASP operates as a latch key prevention program for Montville students in grades 4 – 12. Students who attend the After School Program can choose between a wide variety of recreational and educational activities. Such Activities include: supervised homework help, computer access, outdoor recreational activities, pool, air hockey, video game systems and much more. The After School Program offers students with occasional trips and special activities throughout the year. Completed registration forms must be dropped off in person. # Second Installment of Real Estate Tax

The second installment of Real Estate Tax is due by February 3, 2014 Bills were mailed out in July. You are still responsible for payment even if you did not receive a bill.

The Tax Office also accepts American Express, Discover, MasterCard or Visa credit cards, debit cards and electronic checks to make a payment. Credit card companies charge a convenience fee for using their

cards. The Town passes this fee on to the taxpayer, which is usually about 3% of the transaction amount. The charge for an electronic check is \$2.95.

Taxpayers can view and pay their bill online using a credit card or electronic check. This is a new feature added to the Town's website. It is located under the Tax Collector Department tab.
