Please be sure and stay tuned to the Town of Montville's website for important information and updates: www.townofmontville.org, and remember that my door always remains open.



Of special note: I am thrilled to announce that I have brought in over \$168,000.00 for the Montville Senior Center & Social Services Office for the 2015-2016 fiscal year in grant funds, donations, and fundraisers! The funds collected go to direct services for our Montville residents. I have been very successful over the years in my endeavors of writing and receiving grants, numerous fundraisers, and receiving donations; with the help of dedicated staff, volunteers, and our wonderful Montville community - I look forward to continuing our success for years to come!



HEALTH PROGRAMS

HEALING TOUCH

Healing Touch is available on Fridays, by appointment. Performed by Healing Touch Certified Practitioner Cecelia Sullivan. "HEALING TOUCH is a medically approved therapy, promoting healing. This therapy relieves pain and anxiety, and strengthens the immune system with a light, on-the-body or near-the-body touch."

MedRIDES and MedRIDES II

The Town of Montville Department of Senior & Social Services offers MedRIDE, a FREE transportation for any/all medical





appointments for our senior residents. Doctor appointments, hospital tests & screenings, therapy, pharmacies, dentists, etc. Any medical related appointment. Call Ruthie @ 860-848-0422 for details and to schedule appointments. This program is FREE for our Montville Seniors; a donation box is located on the van for contributions. This program is supported by the Town of Montville and the Eastern Connecticut Area Agency on Aging with Title III funds made available under the Older Americans Act. MedRIDES II is the same type of medical transportation program though it is a joint effort between the Town of Montville and the City of Norwich. Funds are provided by the State of Connecticut. Driver is located out of the Montville Senior Center. Appointments need to be made by calling the Norwich Senior Center at 860-889-5960.

HEALTH CLINIC

We offer a Health Clinic at the Senior Center on Tuesdays from 9:00 - 11:00 am. We have a visiting nurse come to the Center to perform blood pressure, blood sugar, and anemia screenings every week. We are also providing Healing Touch Services at the same time for those interested. All services at the Clinic are FREE - donation box is available for contributions. Call Kathie @ 860-848-0422 for details.



PODIATRIST

We have a wonderful Podiatrist, Dr. Thomas Walter, come to our Center once a month on Wednesday to perform routine foot care. Not a service normally covered by Medicare unless you are a Diabetic, Dr. Walter will perform routine foot care for a cost less than a regular office visit. This Program is free to Montville seniors. Funding for the program is provided by Title III funds made available through the Area Agency on Aging and the Town of Montville. Call Kathie for details and date of next visit.

EQUIPMENT PROGRAM

The Department of Senior and Social Services has medical equipment (i.e. wheel chairs, walkers, shower seats, commodes, etc.) available for our Montville residents on a loan basis. The equipment can be borrowed for any length of time and returned whenever finished. FREE program, a release form must be signed. Call @ 860-848-0422 for details.

MASSAGE THERAPY

Massage Therapy offers many health benefits (relief from arthritis, circulation, aids in digestion, etc.). Appts are free to Montville seniors. Sign up is first come, first serve - one appt per month per senior as the schedule fills up and we have a waiting list each month. Don't miss out on this wonderful program. BETTER HEALTH & SUPPORT SERVICES

We have a wonderful service provided by UCFS to facilitate our Better Healthy & Support Services Program. Designed to help those in need feel good, deal with life's changes, and address other mental health needs, our warm and caring clinician will sit with you individually and/or in a group setting to help you with your needs. The Better Health Program provides a licensed clinician to work one-on-one with our residents along with facilitating group support services. Our program is available for seniors at the Center and our under 60 residents in the Social Services Office. This valuable program is FREE to our Montville residents! The program is supported by the Town of Montville and the Eastern Connecticut Area Agency on Aging with Title III funds made available under the

Older Americans Act. For more details or to sign up, please call Kathie the Director @ 860-848-0422.

ALZHEIMER'S SUPPORT GROUP

We have an Alzheimer's support group here at the Senior Center on the first Friday of every month at 10:00 am. Come get the support you need, you do not have to handle issues alone! Confidential.

HOSPICE SUPPORT GROUP

We have a volunteer from the Hospice Association that comes to facilitate a Hospice support group and activities. Please call the Center for next date and time. Confidential.

GRIEF SUPPORT GROUP

We have a Grief Support Group every Friday from 3:00 - 4:00 pm at the Montville Senior Center. Group is run by a licensed clinician from UCFS and is well attended and received. Group is FREE. The program is supported by the Town of Montville and the Eastern Connecticut Area Agency on Aging with Title III funds made available under the Older Americans Act

HEARING CLINIC

We have a free hearing clinic on the second Thursday of the month (by appointment). Free hearing screening, hearing aid cleaning and screening and minimal ear wax removal. Call for details and/or to sign up!

ENHANCED BENEFIT PROGRAM

The Enhanced Benefit Program is a program our social worker uses to see what/all of the state/federal programs you might qualify for. Information on your current income is needed.

This is done with confidentiality and privacy for you. Our social worker is funded by grant funds made available by Senior Resources with Title III funds.

SOCIAL SERVICES OFFICE

Our Social Services Office and Programs are located in the Old Town Hall Building. (In front of New Town Hall). (Entrance is on the back-side – across from little white house). Our Social Services Building houses are Food Bank, Clothing Bank, Hygiene Bank and Office. Donations can be made directly at the Office or at the Senior Center. All of our assistance programs run entirely on donations, we thank you for your support!

FOOD BANK

Our Social Services Office, @ 860-848-8820 has a fully stocked Food Pantry located in the Social Services Building open Monday - Friday from 8:30 - 3:00 pm or by appt by calling Kathie the Director @ 860-848-0422. We often have canned goods, pasta, cereal, and rice along with frozen meats and breads. We run entirely on donations and are able to distribute what we receive in. We also have FRESH veggies & herbs during the summer months to help those in need! You are welcome to come on a weekly basis to supplement your food needs. We also provide emergency services. Come to the food bank, it is here to help you!



COMMODITY SUPPLEMENTAL FOOD PROGRAM FOR SENIORS

As members of the Gemma Moran Food Center, the Montville Senior & Social Services Department is able to participate in the commodities program for our elderly, 60+. If you are a senior in the Town of Montville and your annual income is \$15,301 (for family of one) and \$20,709 (family of two) you can qualify for this great program! Once a month the Food Center will deliver a box of food filled with great staples (juice, cereal, pasta, powdered milk, & much more) along with a block of cheese to the Montville Food Bank for distribution. 

FIRST INSTALLMENT OF REAL ESTATE TAX

The first installment of Real Estate Tax is due by August 1, 2016. Bills were mailed out June 30, 2016. If you do not receive a tax bill please call the tax office at 860-848-6775.

The Tax Office also accepts American Express, Discover, MasterCard or Visa credit cards, debit cards and electronic checks to make a payment. Credit card companies charge a convenience fee for using their cards. The Town passes this fee on to the taxpayer, which is usually about 3% of the transaction amount. The charge for an electronic check is \$2.95.

Taxpayers can view and pay their bill online using a credit card or electronic check. This is a new feature added to the Town's website. It is located under the Tax Collector Department tab.

After School Program Grades: 4th -12th / Monday - Friday After School until 6 pm Open to Montville Residents Registration Required. 2016-2017 1st Day of School is Wednesday, August 31st.

*Due to the increased interest in our After School Program, we have a waiting list in

place. The ASP is a fee based program. There will be a \$210 registration fee assessed each year your child is in the program. A \$50 non-refundable deposit is due at the time of registration in the program. The remainder of the balance is due 60 days from the original registration date. Parents with more than one child in the ASP will adhere to a tiered payment plan: 1st child - \$210, 2nd child - \$185, 3rd child-\$160, 4th child- \$135. (Parents who have a child/ children placed on the waiting list will not be required to pay the ASP fee until a spot opens in the After School Program.)

Montville ASP operates as a latch key prevention program for Montville students in grades 4 - 12. Students who attend the After School Program can choose between a wide variety of recreational and educational activities. Such Activities include: supervised homework help, computer access, outdoor recreational activities, pool, air hockey, video game systems and much more. The After School Program offers students with occasional trips and special


