

We hope you all had a relaxing and enjoyable summer. The weather gave us lots of diversity with heat, rain, storms, and some beautiful days. I'm sure that many of you felt as I did - it just passes far too quickly!

In June, I attended the graduation ceremony of the Class of 2018, and was delighted that they had wonderful weather, allowing the graduation to take place outside. I was so impressed by the speeches given by graduating students, really indicating the wonderful bond the students have with each other. We are blessed to have a school community that fosters these relationships and does such a wonderful job educating our students. Congratulations to all of the graduates and their families on a job well done. Best wishes for success in their chosen continuing education and careers.

On July 23, 2018, a Special Town Meeting was held to vote on the appropriation for the 1.75 million dollars for the capital improvements to the Phoebe Griffin Noyes Library, as well as an Amendment to the Harbor Management Ordinance. The Meeting Hall at Town Hall was full and it was good to see so many people come out to vote. Both measures passed by a wide margin, and the PGN Library project will likely be done through this fall, with a completion some time in 2019. We are delighted to provide the library with this support, which also secures the grant of an addi-

tional one million dollars from the State of CT. The remainder of the project will be funded through fundraising efforts of the library, so we hope that you will individually support this campaign which will assure that our local library is up to date and efficient.

The annual Midsummer Festival was held on July 27th and 28th, and almost everything went beautifully!

cars, but it was not an ideal viewing! Despite the rain - they were quite beautiful, and we are sorry that so many people had to miss them. For years, the weather has been good to us, so I guess we have to expect rain some time.

#### STILL IMPORTANT TO REMEMBER

The Town of Old Lyme continues to reach out to all residents to improve your efforts on recycling. All of us have an obligation to recycle ONLY acceptable materials, and then, only if they are clean. When we intermingle materials that are not acceptable, we pay additional fees and fines to our haulers. PLEASE HELP US TO IMPROVE OUR RECYCLING EFFORTS - acceptable, clean recyclables only! And remember that the blue bin for garbage is ONLY garbage – no grass clippings, branches, building materials, etc.

The Police Services Options Committee will continue meeting through the fall to assess the services and options for our police services. While we only met once through the summer due to scheduling challenges, we plan on inviting other parties to our meetings to speak about options. While we still had some challenges during our busy beach season, there was an improvement over past years. We will continue to listen and learn how to best address the needs of our community.

The Halls Road Improvements Committee presented an opportunity for the community to meet representatives from Yale Urban Design Workshop, the firm that will be assisting us in developing a master plan for Halls Road. Alan Plattus and Andrei Harwell of YUDW spoke to a group of about 60 residents who attended the meeting and discussed their recent work in other communities and how they would approach this opportunity. In addition, Bob Santos and Courtney Hendricsson from CT Economic Resource Center gave an overview of services that they could provide to our community. Finally, the audience was divided into groups to discuss some of their favorite streets that they have visited, and there was a discussion about the highlights of many of those places. YUDW will be working on some ideas, and provide another opportunity to meet residents and business representatives in the future. 

#### **Assessor's Office**

#### **ASSESSOR DEADLINES 2018**

Did you know our Ownership and Assessment information is updated nightly? Is your mailing information correct? Check out our GIS mapping link on the Town website at: oldlyme-ct.gov.

The Assessor's office would like to inform residents of the following deadlines. All forms and proofs unless noted must be filed by **October 1st 2018** in the Assessor's office located at 52 Lyme St, Old Lyme CT 06371. Our office hours are Monday - Friday 9:00 am - 4:00 pm.

Assessment Date of Taxable Property for the Town of Old Lyme is October 1st of each calendar year.

Per Section 12-41 of the Connecticut General Statutes owners of tangible personal property, other than registered motor vehicles, such as commercial furniture, machinery and equipment, leased equipment, unregistered motor vehicles, camp trailers, etc., are required to file a personal property list with the Assessor. Declarations are required to be filed annually during the month of October. Failure to file prior to November 1, 2018 forces the Assessor, by law, to file the list and add a 25% Penalty (Sec. 12-42, PA 87-245).

**Totally Disabled Persons** are entitled to an exemption if they meet the requirements of Section 12-81(55) of the General Statutes, Please contact our office for acceptable forms of proof.

Any individual who is blind is entitled to an exemption under Section 12-81(17) shall provide proof to the Assessor.

Veterans must have filed a DD214 in the Town Clerk's office by September 30, 2018 in order to receive any of the applicable exemptions under Section 12-81. Sec. 12-81(g) provides for an increase in the property tax exemption amount granted to a qualified veteran if certain income requirements are met applications must be filed with the Assessor's office no later than October 1. Disabled veterans are eligible for an exemption in addition to the regular exemption with the filing of a disability rating from the Veterans Administration.

Under the Federal Service Member Civil Relief Act persons on active duty must present to the Assessor a current earning and leave statement or a letter from their commanding officer along with a yearly application for exemption. Any Servicemen on active duty claiming Connecticut as their legal residence must file prior to Dec 31st.

Property owners interested in claiming land as Farm, Forest

or Open Space should file an application before October 31, 2018. No other extension of this filing period is available, failure to file within the prescribed time is a waiver of the right to the classification for the assessment year commencing October 1st. If you have recently purchased a property and do not know if this applies to you please contact our office to review. Contact us at: 860-434-1605 x218 & 219 or assessor@oldlyme-ct.gov.





#### Middlesex Hospital Strengthens Breast Program

With the addition of nationally recognized breast surgeon Kristen Zarfos, Middlesex Hospital is investing in its breast program and enhancing the services it offers.

Dr. Zarfos joins Dr. Andrea Malon, medical director of the Middlesex Hospital Cancer Center, and Dr. Chia-Chi Wang, a surgical oncologist, as surgeons who treat women who have breast cancer. Together, the trio-with years of surgery experience between them-provide compassionate, individualized care, and they aim to strengthen an already robust breast program.

All three surgeons are part of the Middlesex Hospital Surgical Alliance, and their goal is to coordinate care in a way that helps patients better navigate cancer diagnoses and treatments-in a way that eases fears and makes the process a little easier.

Dr. Zarfos is no stranger to Middlesex Hospital. Her first job after residency was at Middlesex, where she worked from 1987 to 1999. During that time, she became a leader in the national fight to force health insurers to cover hospital stays for mastectomy patients, and she remains a passionate advocate for women's health issues.

Since early detection is key when it comes to all types of cancer, detection technology is at the forefront of Middlesex Hospital's breast program. The hospital offers 3D mammography machines at all of its Radiology locations. These 3D machines detect 40 percent more invasive cancers than 2D machines, which are no longer used by the hospital. Middlesex also offers dual-head molecular breast imaging, which uses a radioactive tracer to better detect breast cancer cells in women with dense breast tissue.

In addition, services like genetic counseling are available to Middlesex patients, and caring nurse navigators at Middlesex Hospital Cancer Center help patients throughout their experience. The Cancer Center has locations in Middletown and Westbrook.

## Transfer Station Information

Transfer Station/Landfill Hours. The Transfer Station is located on Four Mile River Road and is open Tuesday-Friday, 7:30 am - 3:45 pm, Saturday, 8:30 am - 4:00 pm. Closed Sunday and Monday. Taxpayers' vehicles should have a Transfer Station sticker affixed to the right-hand side of windshield. Vehicles without a sticker should bring proof of property address (i.e., tax bill, mortgage statement or closing papers), along with a driver's license and registration.

The Transfer Station will be closed on the following Holidays: Thursday, November 22 and Friday, November 23, 2018 for Thanksgiving. The Transfer Station will be open at 8:30 am on Saturday, November 24, 2018.

#### **BULKY WASTE AND DEMOLITION**

Vehicles will be charged by weight at \$110/ton. Recyclables should not be mixed in the same load with bulky waste or demolition debris. Loads less than 100 lbs. are charged a minimum fee of \$5.

**Brush** is charged on a per load basis. No wood or limbs thicker than four inches are accepted.

**Grass clippings** are not allowed at the Transfer Station because of chemical contamination from pesticides and fertilizers and cannot be deposited in your trash can. Please compost on your property.

Electronics are now accepted at the Transfer Station. Residents can bring the following items to the Transfer Station on Four Mile River Road: computers (personal computers, mainframes, med-range computers, laptops); networking equipment (hubs, switches, control cards, etc.); computer monitors, televisions, printers, keyboards, mice, adaptors, stereos, speakers, VCR's, scanners, fax machines, copiers telephones and telephone systems, computer wire and cable; computer drives and storage devices (floppy drives, CD ROMs, hard drives), power supplies, circuit boards, microwaves, scrap copper (cable, pipe, etc.), scrap aluminum (machine and machine parts, cable extrusions, etc.), fluorescent light bulbs, UPA (uninterrupted power supply) batteries, and related computer and electronic equipment.

#### **Trash and Recycling**

Curbside trash removal is performed by Old Lyme Sanitation. You can contact us at: 860-434-3800. There is no trash pick-up on the following Holidays: Christmas (Dec. 25), New Year's (Jan. 1), Memorial Day (last Monday in May), July 4th, Labor Day (first Monday in Sept.), and Thanksgiving Day (fourth Thursday in Nov.). Please have trash container out at curbside by 6:00 am on your assigned day. Containers should be three feet away from any other objects, such as mailboxes, cars, other containers, planters, etc. Please be mindful not to block breakdown/emergency lane with receptacle. Clearly mark your address on recycling and trash receptacles to avoid mix up, removal or displacement of cans. Phone Michele Hayes at: 860-434-1605, ext. 212 with any additional trash removal questions that you may have.

Single stream curbside recycling pick-up is provided for clean bottles, cans, plastics and paper products co-mingled in the green recycling carts every other week. Corrugated cardboard boxes need to be flattened for recycling. ### What to do with Fallen Leaves

Our Public Works Director has advised us that some of our property owners may be confused about what to do with fallen leaves. The Town of Old Lyme does not provide residential leaf pick up.

Some property owners contract with local landscapers for leaf removal. Others compost the leaves on their properties. Many rake & bag their leaves, and bring them to the Transfer Station on Four Mile River Road. The minimum charge for disposal is \$5 and residents must empty and remove leaf bags.

#### Keeping storm drains clear is a matter of public safety.

Town crews clear storm drains of debris, including the small quantity of leaves that may blow into the drain area. We ask that residents do their part, as well, to prevent leaves and brush from their properties from settling in the street and near storm drains. Thank you for your cooperation.


## The Old Lyme Conservation Commission

#### KNOW THE SOURCE OF THE FOOD ON YOUR TABLE

The area of food is particularly fraught with opposing opinions-where it comes from, how it is being grown and processed, what chemicals are added, and the results. However, if you want to make different decisions about the food you purchase for your family, watch a recent NETFLIX series.

**Rotten** is a six-part documentary that is a hybrid of activist documentary and true crime series. Each episode covers a different part of the food industry: bees, peanuts, garlic, chickens, milk, and fish. While the horrors of industrial meat production have been publicized, **Rotten**...also looks at pantry products you might never think about, such as honey and garlic.

According to a review in GQ magazine, *Rotten* scrutinizes...cost-cutting multinational corporations... and the crimes, frauds, and horrors of the food in your fridge. You'll learn that the honey you squirt in your tea is adulterated with cheap syrup and that people are three times as likely to be hospitalized for food allergies now as they were 20 years ago.



The article admits that, while *Rotten* is not the best documentary you'll ever watch... It is worth watching because it exposes corruption and questionable-practices from the farm to the dining room table. The overall message: cost-cutting corporate food production causes countless problems, and if there is a solution it lies in sustainable organic farming that can "minimize cruelty, but still generate profits." ## Nature Program at Lyme-Old Lyme Elementary Schools

#### ROGER TORY PETERSON ESTUARY CENTER PROVIDES SCIENCE IN NATURE PROGRAM AT LYME-OLD LYME ELEMENTARY SCHOOLS

The Connecticut Audubon Society's (CAS) Roger Tory Peterson Estuary Center in Old Lyme provided its award-winning Science in Nature Education Program to Lyme-Old Lyme elementary school classrooms in the 2017-2018 school year at Mile Creek and Lyme Consolidated Schools for the second consecutive year. The program served the 251 students and their teachers in the third through fifth grade.

The CAS's Science in Nature programs consist of hands-on, inquiry-based activities that relate to earth and life sciences, ecology, conservation and citizenship. These programs are an invaluable resource for building student and teacher learning capacity by providing opportunities to enhance critical thinking skills, using and designing models, and developing evidence-based explanations of natural phenomena.

The Lyme-Old Lyme Science in Nature program was specifically tailored for Connecticut River Estuary study, allowing students to explore their unique ecosystems, and to appreciate the important environmental issues local to them, while engaging in their intensive hands-on study of science topics including weather and climate, bird ecology, wetland ecology and geology. Field studies took place either on school grounds or in local natural spaces near each school at the Mile Creek Preserve and the Jewett Preserve.

The CAS focus is on both the Connecticut student experience and on building teacher capacity to be science educators. Emphasis is placed on teacher support throughout the entire program, which is a critical feature in the current climate of high stakes testing. Science in Nature is curriculum-based, linked with classroom lessons, with materials driven by teachers' current science lessons. All content is developed only for Connecticut students using Connecticut place-based experiences.

Ian Neviaser, Superintendent of Lyme-Old Lyme Schools, has fully endorsed the program. He said, "The Science in Nature program has been extremely beneficial to both the students and staff. With the introduction of the Next Generation Science Standards, we could not be more pleased to have the opportunity to provide our students with 'hands on' science experiences. We are grateful to the Roger Tory Peterson Estuary Center for all of the work they have done to put this amazing program in place."

#### Lymes' Youth Services Bureau Acquires an AED

Lymes' Youth Services Bureau (LYSB) is happy to announce the acquisition of an Automated External Defibrillator (AED) installed in its main Activity Center on Lyme Street. The addition of the LYSB's new AED contributes to the growing number of readily available lifesaving tools and skills that are part of the Connecticut Department of Public Health's "HEARTSafe Community" award to the Town of Old Lyme.

Critical Skills Education & Training owners Colleen Atkinson and Doug Lo Presti are local Emergency Medical Technicians and American Heart Association Instructors who have coordinated the Town's HEARTSafe Community award through three renewals, continuing the placement of AEDs and training of hundreds of individuals who live and work in Old Lyme. Training consists of Adult, Child and Infant CPR, use of an AED and relieving an obstructed airway.

The purchase of the AED was funded partially by contributions made by Critical Skills through classes held at LYSB but the principal contribution came from the non-profit group CT Trailmixers, a Southington-based trail running club whose members are passionate about sharing the love and use of trails in the state of

Connecticut. The Trailmixers' mission also includes making donations to a variety of causes and organizations, including the Southington YMCA and the Connecticut Forest & Parks Association. Proceeds also go to the CT Trailmixers' Shoe Scholarship Program which, in partnership with Fleet Feet West Hartford, gives free shoes to kids in need who want to run cross-country or track in school. Michael Lo Presti, founder and President, reached out to Critical Skills for candidates and LYSB was suggested.

The Trailmixers' generous donation put the fundraising effort over-the-top and the AED was purchased and installed in May.

This is a Public Access Defibrillator (PAD), and is available to trained and untrained bystanders alike in case of emergency. #### **Expanding Veterans' Benefits**



This past legislative session, the General Assembly unanimously passed SB 284: An Act Concerning Benefits for Certain Veterans Who Have Been Diagnosed with Post-Traumatic Stress Disorder or Traumatic Brain Injury or Who Have Had an Experience of Military Sexual Trauma. This legislation expands certain veterans' benefits to former service members with an "other-than-honorable" discharge who have a "qualifying condition." A "qualifying condition" means diagnosis of post-traumatic stress disorder or traumatic brain injury made by, or a military sexual trauma experience disclosed

to, an individual licensed to provide care at a U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs facility. The Department of Veterans Affairs will have a form on its website that veterans can take to a VA hospital or a veterans' center for certification.

The legislation includes, but is not limited to, extending the following benefits to continued on page 26

veterans who meet eligibility: preference for certain affordable rental housing, state high school diploma exam fee waivers, tuition waivers for Connecticut public colleges and universities if the veteran served in time of war, certain property tax exemptions, veterans status on driver's license and identity cards, and certain assistance programs that assist veterans and their families with finances, healthcare, and food. As under existing law, some of these ben-

efits are limited to veterans with war time service. Prior to this legislation, these special benefits were only available to veterans who were honorably discharged or released under honorable conditions from active service in the armed services.


About 800 Connecticut veterans will be positively impacted and will be able to get the assistance they need and deserve. This law is set to go into effect on October 1, 2018. We are working on procuring assistive listening devices that can be used with the sound system in the meeting hall.


If you haven't already done so, check out the new accessible playground at Cross Lane.



# Two Local Groups Join Forces to Promote Adult Literacy in Haiti

Old Lyme's The Crosby Fund for Haitian Education, www.crosbyfund.org, and Sister Cities Essex Haiti, www.Sistercities esexhaiti.org, have created a new collaborative effort to further literacy for adults in rural Deschapelles, Haiti.

Many rural Haitians have the basic skills needed to survive but cannot read or write. The Crosby Fund, established in 2004 has expanded its original mission, providing scholarships for youth who would not otherwise be able to attend school. (The Fund currently serves over 463 students in more than 80 schools) The Crosby Fund

now has a government approved "Adult Literacy" program for adults primarily over the age of 40. The program currently has 116 students.

Sister Cities Essex Haiti, founded in 2010 after the earthquake, collaborates with an all-volunteer organization in Deschapelles supporting projects requested by the community that benefit the community. Their major project is the Deschapelles Community Library which has over 4,000 books in French and Kreyol. (Most residents of Deschapelles lack electricity and access to books was very limited) The

Deschapelles Community Library welcomes these adults and enables them to read books in Kreyol with illustrations that supplement the text. Two reading clubs have begun: a Reading Club for the adults who can gather at the library and read books together, and a Club for youth to read one-on-one with their newly literate elders.

All the leadership and activities in these two organizations are run by local Haitians. Their support by the generous donors from each side of the CT River make all the difference.

# THE MUSEUM'S FALL EXHIBITION CELEBRATES SELDOM-SEEN WORKS ON PAPER AND OCTOBER BRINGS THE 10TH ANNUAL WEE FAERIE VILLAGE

Within the Florence Griswold Museum's collection, works on paper represent a key component of the institution's "founding documents." Paper Trail: American Prints, Drawings, and Watercolors, on view September 29, 2018 through January 27, 2019, highlights the importance of these work. During the Lyme Art Colony's heyday artists gathered around Florence Griswold's parlor table to make drawings-playing the "Wiggle Game"-an amusement where one artist was challenged to finish a drawing of disparate lines begun by another. From that kernel of works the collection has grown in scope to include Connecticut artists using ink, graphite, watercolor, and pastel on paper from Colonial times to the present. 

#### **Unusual White Wines**

There are so many different grapes grown in the world making for a vast amount of interesting wines. Every once in a while we should explore some of these unusual wines. Here are just a few wines that are slowly growing in popularity.

The first wine we will discuss comes mostly from the country of Austria. The grape is called Grűner Veltiner, this being the most widely grown grape in that country. The wine is late harvested but it does develop into a slightly peppery, full bodied, but dry crisp finish. The wine can also age well to become a richer and more complex wine. The next wine has become a very popular as a just sitting around sipping wine. It is from Portugal, called Vinho Verde, which means "Green Wine." The wine is light in color and also light in body. The wine has good acidity and a little spritz to it. The region it is grown in is controlled by law not to produce a wine to exceed 11.5% alcohol content. Due to this, the wine should be drunk young, as it will be most refreshing at this point.

Muscadet is a wine produced in France at the beginning of the Loir valley. The Muscadet area only grows one grape, Melon de Bourgogne, which has been around since the 17th century. The most predominate growing region for this wine is Muscadet-Servre et Maine where as much as 75% of this wine

This means the wine "rests on the lees," (which is the dead yeast, left over seeds and pulp from the grapes produced during the wine process, right after fermentation). # State Withholding on IRA Distributions Paid to Connecticut Residents

A new rule is in effect for Connecticut residents with taxable pension, annuity or IRA distributions. For 2018, any entity making taxable pension or annuity payments or distributions from an IRA (or other tax-deferred retirement plan such as a 401(k), 403(b), or tax sheltered annuity) to a resident of Connecticut will be required to withhold state income taxes from those payments at the default rate of 6.99%. Eligible account holders/payment recipients may elect a lesser withholding rate or amount by providing the payer with

a properly completed Form CT W-4P Withholding Certificate for Pension or Annuity Payments. This form is available at: www.ct.gov/drs.

This new requirement applies to pensions, annuities and retirement accounts. This may be a good time to meet with your tax advisor to review your overall withholding or estimated payment plan for 2018. The IRS updated the income-tax withholding tables for 2018 to reflect changes made by the Tax Cuts and Jobs Act at the end of

2017. It's worth remembering that under-withholding may lead to an unexpected tax bill instead of an anticipated refund as well as the potential for incurring penalties.

### **Old Lyme Historical Society**

Located in the former Grange Hall at 55 Lyme Street, we are an all-volunteer organization dedicated to researching, preserving, and sharing the history of Old Lyme.

When the Old Lyme Grange moved their meeting hall to its new location on Lyme St., they also made major addi-

tions. They extended the building significantly to create a stage in the main hall, and built a dining area and kitchen on the ground floor below. The renovated Grange Hall of 1928 was designed for meetings of course; but also to host the performances, lectures, dances, and community suppers that had long been the main social events for education and entertainment alike.

The original kitchen (alas!) was long gone when the Old Lyme Historical Society acquired the building. Our climate-controlled archive and a reading room now take up the ground floor. Removing a mid-century dropped ceiling allowed the original bead-board of the main hall to shine once again. The "Grand Drape" (a stage backdrop and fire curtain from 1928) has been

carefully restored. Its advertisements for local businesses of the day show a surprising number of still-familiar names. The last major project is the installation of a lift to make our whole facility handicapped-accessible. Work is well advanced at this writing (early August). With successful fundraising, the lift should be installed by the time you read this.

With our own restoration and renovations nearing completion, the Old Lyme Historical Society continues the tradition of public events in this historic space with a Summer/Fall lecture series. The photo left, shows the first of this series given in July. Coming up this month is a talk by Wick Griswold on Connecticut ferries (Monday, September 17, 7:00 pm). Old Lyme's Town Historian, Dr. John (Ned) Pfeiffer will speak about local history on Monday, October 1 at 7:00 pm. Additional lectures are in the works.

### The last word...

Joey Logano - Inspiring others to do for others

Professional NASCAR driver Joey Logano started his racing career right here in Connecticut racing quarter midget cars and quickly made a name for himself. Starting at the age of six, the Middletown, CT native started winning championship after championship – to the point that, by the time he was 15, he was already on the radar with NASCAR racing legends. Now, he's always to be reckoned with on the NASCAR racing scene, competing full-time in the Monster Energy NASCAR series and part-time in the NASCAR Xfinity series.

- 49 combined wins in NASCAR's top-three series

There is, of course, the glitz and the glamor that pervades NASCAR as a whole. And there's the occasional race-action controversy. And there are the ups and downs. After early successes (leading to the nickname, "Sliced Bread") and nearly winning a championship in 2016, Joey failed to make the playoffs in 2017. This year could mark a turnaround. Joey notched a win at Talladega Superspeedway in April, which ended a nearly year-long winless streak and, as of press time, he is fifth in the NASCAR Championship Point Standings.

But there's more to the 28-year-old than that. Joey and his wife Brittany, whom he married in 2014, welcomed their first child into the world this past January. Joey and Brittany have also been very committed to giving back. In a previous conversation, Joey mentioned, "If we can touch a few people's lives and help them become contributing members of our community and the world, it's really going to make a difference and it starts one person at a time." That's the crux of the Joey Logano Foundation that invests in organizations offering second chances to children and young adults during times of crisis and works to inspire others to live a life of generosity.

#### WHY SECOND CHANCES?

First, there was a life-changing visit to Joplin, Missouri in 2011 where Joey helped to rebuild a home for a local family following the tornado that devastated the area. That family needed a second chance. Little did Joey know that he would soon need his own second chance. He had been driving the No. 20 Toyota Camry for Joe Gibbs Racing since the 2009 season, but that ended in 2012. He received his second chance when he was picked up by Penske Racing in 2012. The following year, the Joey Logano Foundation was established.



Since 2013, the foundation has invested almost \$2.7 million in various organizations across the country. Programs include inviting children who are facing tough situations (whether physically and/or emotionally) annually to a NASCAR race to be part of the crew for the day, supporting non-profit organizations during the 10-week NASCAR playoffs in each playoff race market, assembling and donating comfort care backpacks to foster and/or terminally ill children, and an annual fundraiser in Connecticut, called Driving Hope Home. A portion of the Driving Hope Home proceeds are donated to The Ronald McDonald House of Connecticut with the remaining proceeds donated to reputable charities the foundation supports to offer children in need a first or second chance. "It's our responsibility. You have to do it. If we we're not going to do it, who else is going to be an advocate for these kids," says Brittany, who notes that first chances are important too. "They need a first opportunity in life. If we can shed light to this and inspire others to do the same, we can have a bigger impact than the two of us. That's our goal."

There is no doubt that Joey is a fierce competitor and a pure NASCAR racing talent. But don't overlook the other side. "When you are able to make a difference like that, you can see it in that person's face, how much it affects their lives - there's no better feeling than that," he observes. "I can talk about race wins as much as I want and how great that is but there's nothing better than that win - when you're are able to affect something. That's a bigger win than any racetrack can get you."
