#### The First Selectman's Corner

I am happy to report that the Guilford Town and School budget was approved by voters at the first referendum. This budget will result in a 1.88% operating expenditures increase. However, at the writing of this column, the State of Connecticut has yet to approve a budget and we don't know how that budget will affect the Town of Guilford. We have pledged to the taxpayers that the mill rate of 29.36 set by the Board of Finance on April 28 will not be affected by the actions of the General Assembly or the governor as they finalize the state budget.

I am also pleased to report that on May 31, the voters of Guilford approved at referendum the proposal to extend the public water main to the communities of Mulberry Point, Tuttle's Point and Long Cove by 89%. The next step in the process is for the water company to get final approval from PURA (Public Utilities Regulatory Authority). Once that is received, then we can begin the final design phase and start construction. Since over 80% of residents in those three communities have submitted deposits along with their commitment agreements to the water company, the water company will contribute \$1.5 million of the \$3.4 million total project cost. The remaining cost of the project will be charged to the residents of those three communities through special assessments.

The Town received a Federal Grant for \$1.4 million through the South Central Region Council of Governments for design and construction of a pathway from Adams School to the Guilford Lakes School and to the Timberlands open space property. This project is in an infancy stage in that we have secured the funds, but it has yet to be

designed. The first step is to have an informational meeting to gather input from the public sometime after Labor Day.

I would like to welcome Warren "Butch" Hyatt who was hired as the new Deputy Chief of the Guilford Police Department effective April 3, 2017. Deputy Chief Hyatt replaces Jack Dunn who recently retired to become Police Chief of Hull, Massachusetts. We all wish Deputy Chief Hyatt a long and successful career in Guilford. Also, I am proud to announce Captain Mike Shove of the Guilford Fire Department was promoted on February 13, 2017 to Assistant Chief of Operations replacing Assistant Chief Wayne Vetre who retired and accepted a Fire Chief position in Wells, Maine. We wish Assistant Chief Shove a successful career in his new position. continued on page 4



### **Assessor's Office**

#### MOTOR VEHICLE TAX BILLS

were mailed in June. If between October 2nd and August 31st you sold or totaled your vehicle and did not replace it, or if you registered your car out of state, then you may, with the submission of acceptable proof, be eligible for a tax reduction for that motor vehicle tax bill.

# PERSONAL PROPERTY DECLARATION FORMS

will, as a courtesy, be mailed in September to all persons known to be conducting

business in the Town of Guilford as of October 1, 2017. Said forms must be filed by November 1, 2017. If not, penalties will be applied. Forms will also be available online on the Town's website under the Assessor's Office.

The following is an abbreviated look at some of the exemption programs that the Assessor's Office administers. Some programs are State programs which means they are available in all towns. Some programs are local programs which

means they are available in Guilford and only available in other towns that have also passed an ordinance authorizing that particular program. If you think you might be eligible for any of these programs, please call the Assessor's Office, Monday through Friday, 9:00 am to 4:00 pm for more information. 

Please note: Exemptions are always stated in assessment dollars. To calculate the actual tax savings, multiply the assessment exemption amount by the appropriate mill rate (e.g., the assessment exemption amount is \$1,000 and say the mill rate is 22.36 so the tax savings is \$22.36 or \$1,000 times 0.02236).

#### **VETERANS (STATE PROGRAM)**

must have their honorable discharge papers (full copy DD-214: must contain Block #24) on file with the Town Clerk by September 29, 2017 in order to receive a \$3,000 assessment exemption on the October 1, 2017 Grand List. Once filed in Guilford, there is no need to re-file. Veterans moving into Guilford from another town must re-file their DD-214 in Guilford by September 29, 2017 to receive this exemption. Administratively, the exemption is applied to real estate, even if recorded in the spouse's name only. If real estate is not owned, then it is applied to one's motor vehicle.

#### VETERANS (LOCAL PROGRAM),

who qualify for the above-described program, may, depending upon income, qualify for an additional \$10,000 assessment exemption. Income, including Social Security, cannot exceed \$60,200 for a single individual and \$67,900 for a married couple. Applications must be filed no later than September 29, 2017.

#### **VETERANS (STATE PROGRAM),**

who qualify for the Veterans State Program (described above), may qualify for an additional exemption depending upon income. The amount of the assessment exemption will vary. Income cannot exceed \$35,200 for a single individual or \$42,900 for a married couple. Applications must be filed no later than September 29, 2017.

# DISABLED TAXPAYERS (STATE PROGRAM)

must file their Award Letter (issued by the Social Security Administration) with the Assessor's Office by September 29, 2017

in order to receive a \$1,000 assessment exemption.

# DISABLED TAXPAYERS (LOCAL PROGRAM),

who qualify for the above-described program, may qualify for an additional \$1,000 assessment exemption depending upon income. Income cannot exceed \$35,200 for a single individual and \$42,900 for a married couple. Applications must be filed no later than September 29, 2017.

# BLIND TAXPAYERS (STATE PROGRAM)

must file a Certification of Legal Blindness (issued by the Board of Education and Services for the Blind, State of Connecticut, Wethersfield, CT) with the Assessor's Office by September 29, 2017 in order to receive a \$3,000 assessment exemption.

# BLIND TAXPAYERS (LOCAL PROGRAM),

who qualify for the above-described





program, may qualify for an additional \$2,000 assessment exemption, depending upon income. Income cannot exceed \$35,200 for a single individual and \$42,900 for a married couple. Applications must be filed no later than September 29, 2017.

FARM, FOREST LAND AND OPEN SPACE (STATE PROGRAM)

applications must be filed between September 1, 2017 and October 31, 2017.

FARM BUILDINGS (LOCAL PROGRAM) used exclusively for farming activities by

farmers who are receiving an exemption for their farm equipment may be exempt. An application must be filed no later than October 31, 2017.

## **Economic Development Department**

By the time this issue is published, we are hoping for sunny weather and the real feeling of summer. Our spring was wet enough and we are all ready to enjoy our community with many of our outdoor attractions and events.

Many have been asking about the activity at 350 Goose Lane, the former Wilbur & King Nursery. Although we reported earlier that it was being considered for a condominium development, that use was not approved on that site. The developer, Horton Group, reverted to a previously approved use for office space. As such, the Stone Insurance Agency will be moving its operations from its in town location to the post and beam front building, consisting of about 4.5K sf. Two additional office buildings are planned for the site, one at 16K sf and another at 24K sf. Tenants are being pursued and we hope to be in a position to announce something soon. Horton Group is also responsible for the re-development of

The Residences at 66 High Street. Construction is complete on the former Mill Building and only a few remaining units are for sale. Construction on the new Whitfield Building is nearing completion, with the model unit open for inspection, a few units are occupied and a few are on deposit. The next new building, the Leete, has the basic foundation in place and more cement and steel work will be occurring over the next 3-6 months. Progress continues with the Patriot Medical Center, with the first building nearing completion while the second is being framed. The front sidewalk has been installed, along with landscaping. A third building has been approved and will be located on the rear of the lot, essentially behind the building on the front left. U Haul (former Mannix Auto Dealership-Antique Store and Flea Market) pulled its initial application and continues to work with several town agencies to enhance its project. We are now estimating a continued on page 8

July-August timeframe for U Haul to seek final approvals, enabling construction to begin late fall if approved. Some have been asking about the former Village Francais building, located at the corner of Rt.1 and Long Hill Road. The building was purchased for medical use and is currently being renovated.

So much of our community and character is based on the businesses that operate in Guilford. We may utilize them or even pass by them daily without giving them much thought. However, we would like to begin recognizing our businesses and THANK them for being such an important part of Guilford. # Do You Have Tingling or Numbness in your Fingers and Hands?

Tingling and numbness in the hands and fingers occurs frequently and many times the people experiencing these symptoms are unsure of the cause. The nerves that supply information to your hands and fingers have their origin in the middle to lower neck and upper part of the mid back (cervical and thoracic spine). These nerves travel from the neck through the shoulder area, elbow and then the wrist to send information from your brain to your fingers. Any interference to the nerve system along that pathway can result in tingling or numbness, weakness in grip or hands and fingers falling asleep.

On occasion the bones in the wrist (carpels) can be misaligned causing a narrowing of the canal where the nerve travels through, resulting in carpel tunnel syndrome. Other times nerve interference can result from tightness around the nerves traveling through the elbow or shoulder areas often due to injury,

poor posture or misalignment. The most common area that we find to be involved is the mid to lower cervical spine and the upper thoracic spine (neck and upper back). This part of our spine is often out of its proper alignment due to trauma, such as a slip or fall, sports injury or automobile accident, or due to repetitive head forward and down postures such as computer and desk work, texting, reading or watching TV in bed or on the couch with your head propped up.

The cervical spine is designed to have a C shaped forward curve when viewed from the side which reduces stress on the discs, joints, spinal cord and nervous system. When examining and taking x-rays of our patients who present with symptoms of hands and fingers tingling, numbness or hands falling asleep, we find that the normal C shaped curve is lost and often times it is actually reversed. This abnormal spinal alignment and function will

produce increased stress on the nerve system as well as the discs and joints in the neck which over time will result in degenerative arthritis.

Doctors of Chiropractic are trained to evaluate the spine, shoulder, elbow and wrist for proper alignment and function and to determine where the interference to the nerve system is originating. Most times specific chiropractic adjustments can help restore proper alignment and function to the cervical and thoracic spine, shoulder, elbow and wrist, reducing interference to the nerves, thereby reducing many of their symptoms. #### **Periodontal Disease in Small Animals**

Periodontal disease is the number one health problem in small animals. Periodontal disease includes gingivitis (inflammation or redness of the gums) and periodontitis (loss of bone and soft tissue around the teeth).

THERE ARE 4 STAGES OF PERIODONTAL DISEASE. In Stage 1 periodontal disease, the teeth are coated with plaque, a sticky film of bacteria, and your pet may have some gingivitis. At this point there is no bone loss and dental treatment can reverse the condition.

In Stage 2 periodontal disease, the gums are swollen and the teeth are covered with both plaque and tartar. Tartar is the hard yellow substance that forms on teeth when plaque calcifies. Your pet's mouth can be sore and bad breath is noticeable. At this stage there is less than 25% loss of the bone surrounding the teeth.

**In Stage 3 periodontal disease,** your pet will have consistently bad breath, a painful mouth, and bright red and even

bleeding gums. You may notice that your pet's mouth pain is so severe that it affects eating and behavior. At this stage there may be as much as 25% - 50% periodontal bone loss.

In Stage 4 periodontal disease, there is advanced periodontitis with chronic infection destroying the gums and teeth. Bone loss is usually greater than 50%. Bacteria from infected gums, teeth and bone may spread to the bloodstream and damage the kidneys, liver and heart.

Regardless of the stage of periodontal disease, many pets show minimal outward clinical signs, and thus therapy may not be initiated until late in the disease process. At Guilford Veterinary Hospital, we offer dental treatments for all stages. We especially recommend performing stage 1 dental treatments to keep your pet happy and healthy - and so periodontal disease does not progress to stages 2, 3 or 4.
