Dear Members of the Montville Community, Happy Summer Montville! As we move from spring to summer I look forward to continuing to pursue opportunities for economic growth & development in our town.



The Department of Senior & Social Services consists of two offices; the Social Services Office, designed to assist the general public and the Senior Services Office & Senior Center designed to assist the elderly population.

The Senior Center is located at 12 Maple Avenue, Uncasville and offers a wide range of services. Senior Services provide our elderly with information and assistance for relevant / pertinent issues. The primary function of the Senior Services Department is to provide assistance, services, referrals, and information to our elderly population and their families, as well as planning, administering, organizing, and supervising all programs and services within the Center. We provide a great many services along with recreational activities. We have an extremely active, busy Senior Center with a great deal to offer our Montville seniors; call 860-848-0422.

The Social Services Office is located in the Old Town Hall. (In front of current Town Hall). The Social Services Office offers the privacy needed for our low or no-income residents and those facing hardships and crisis. Confidentially is of the utmost importance for our clients as we believe they deserve and need to receive services and assistance with compassion in a comfortable setting. The primary function of the Social Services Office is to provide immediate assistance and crisis intervention for Montville residents. We also provide weekly supplemental food assistance, direct social services programs, application assistance for state and federal programs, resources and referrals, and much more; call 860-848-0422.

Senior Centers are vital to the elderly community and provide many recreational programs along with many other necessary services: social services (energy assistance, food stamps, Medicaid, SSI), Medicare, Medicare Managed Care, Medigaps, Medicare Savings Programs, Benefits Check, Renter's Rebates, general information & assistance, and many more. We also offer many health programs right at the Center to afford all of our seniors access to the necessary medical services they might not receive otherwise. I am always looking to add to our extensive list of activities and services and my goal is always to offer them for FREE for ALL of our Montville seniors! I am proud to be able to bring all that I can to our Montville seniors.

HEALTH PROGRAMS

HEALING TOUCH

Healing Touch is available on Fridays, by appointment. Performed by Healing Touch Certified Practitioner Cecelia Sullivan. "Healing Touch" is a medically approved therapy, promoting healing. This therapy relieves pain and anxiety, and strengthens the immune system with a light, on-the-body or near-the-body touch.

MedRIDES and MedRIDES II

The Town of Montville Department of Senior & Social Services offers MedRIDE, a FREE transportation for any/all medical appointments for our senior residents. Doctor appointments, hospital tests & screenings, therapy, pharmacies, dentists, etc. Any medical related appointment. Call Ruthie @ 860-848-0422 for details and to schedule appointments. This program is free for our Montville Seniors; a donation box is located on the van for contributions. This program is supported by the Town of Montville and the Eastern Connecticut Area Agency on Aging with Title III funds made available under the Older Americans Act. MedRIDES II is the same type of medical transportation **Montville Events Quarter 3 2015** program though it is a joint effort between the Town of Montville and the City of Norwich. Funds are provided by the State of Connecticut. Driver is located out of the Montville Senior Center. Appointments need to be made by calling the Norwich Senior Center at 860-889-5960.

HEALTH CLINIC

We offer a Health Clinic at the Senior Center on Tuesdays from 9:00 – 11:00 a.m. We have a visiting nurse come to the Center to perform blood pressure, blood sugar, and anemia screenings every week. We are also providing Healing Touch Services at the same time for those interested. All services at the Clinic are FREE – donation box is available for contributions. Call Kathie @ 860-848-0422 for details.

PODIATRIST

We have a wonderful Podiatrist, Dr. Thomas Walter, come to our Center once a month on Wednesday to perform routine foot care. Not a service normally covered by Medicare unless you are a Diabetic. Dr. Walter will perform routine foot care for a cost less than a regular office visit. This Program is free to Montville seniors. Funding for the program is provided by Title III funds made available through the Area Agency on Aging and the Town of Montville. Call Kathie for details and date of next visit.

EQUIPMENT PROGRAM

The Department of Senior and Social Services has medical equipment (i.e. wheel chairs, walkers, shower seats, commodes, etc.) available for our Montville residents on a loan basis. The equipment can be borrowed for any length of time and returned whenever finished. FREE program, a release form must be signed. Call @ 860-848-0422 for details.

MASSAGE THERAPY

Massage Therapy offers many health benefits (relief from arthritis, circulation, aids in digestion, etc.) Appointments are FREE to Montville seniors. Sign up is first come, first serve – one appt per month per senior as the schedule fills up and we have a waiting list each month. Don't miss out on this wonderful program. ENHANCED BENEFIT PROGRAM

The Enhanced Benefit Program is a program our social worker uses to see what/ all of the state/federal programs you might qualify for. Information on your current income is needed. VETERANS SPECIAL FUND

We have a Special Social Services Program, specifically for our Veterans, to help with the social services they might need. Fundraisers and donations will be used to supply the Veterans Fund, much like the fund the Director has for our residents in need. The program will run entirely on donations. The Veterans Fund is designed to help our veterans with "life necessities" and crisis and difficulties that may arise. This is designed specifically for our Veterans in need. SOCIAL SERVICES OFFICE

FOOD BANK

Our Social Services Office, @ 860-848-8820 has a fully stocked Food Pantry located in the Social Services Building open on Monday – Friday from 8:30 – 3:00 p.m. or by appt. by calling Kathie the Director @ 860-848-0422. We often have canned goods, pasta, cereal, and rice along with frozen meats and breads. We run entirely on donations and are able to distribute what we receive. We also have FRESH veggies & herbs during the summer months to help those in need! You are welcome to come on a weekly basis to supplement your food needs. We also provide emergency services. Come to the food bank, it is here to help you.

NEW COMMODITY SUPPLEMENTAL FOOD PROGRAM FOR SENIORS

As members of the Gemma Moran Food Center, the Montville Senior & Social Services Department is able to participate in a new commodities program for our elderly, 60+. If you are a senior in the Town of Montville and your annual income is \$15,301 (for a family of one) and \$20,709 (family of two) you can qualify for this great program. Once a month the Food Center will deliver a box of food filled with great staples (juice, cereal, pasta, powdered milk, & much more) along with a block of cheese to the Montville Food Bank for distribution. You must fill out an application (myself and staff can help with that) and include a copy of income to participate in program. Redetermination is only twice a year - food boxes are distributed monthly. If interested in this great new program, please call Robin @ 860-848-8820 or Kathie @860-848-0422.

CLOTHING BANK

Do you need that power outfit for your job or a job interview? Or do you need clothes for every day wear? Come to the Montville Senior & Social Services Clothing Bank. If you need access to a computer for job search, unemployment benefits, apartment rentals, etc. or maybe you need to update and print your resume, please come in and utilize this wonderful service. INTERVIEW ATTIRE PROGRAM

We have an Interview Attire Program that is full of the appropriate clothing needed to make your first impression a good one when going on a job interview! "You never get a second chance to make a first impression!" Come to the Social Services Building and ask about our Interview Attire Program! Robin will try to help to make sure you put your best foot forward and hopefully the opportunity of landing that job! If you would like to donate to this program, please bring items to the Social Services Building.

SPORTS CLOSET PROGRAM

We are close to having a stocked SPORTS CLOSET within our Social Services Office to afford all of the children in our Town the equipment needed to participate in their designated sport. 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

Is Your Smartphone Hurting You?

Remember when your parents would always yell at you to "sit up straight." Or see if you can "walk with an apple on your head without dropping it?" It may have seemed like a hassle but they were helping us to develop good posture. Most adults and children sit, looking down, at their I-phones, I-pads and video games in their laps. That is four adult sized bowling balls, six bags of groceries, or an eight year old child sitting right on top of your head!

Children suffer most. Kids under age 18 spend the most time on their devices texting. As many as 2800 text per month are being reported! Neck and low back pain are developing as a result of this bad posture and has been termed "text neck". This means that their spines, which are still developing, are in serious jeopardy for pain. Montville Youth Service Bureau Programs

After School Program / Grades: 4th -12th Monday – Friday / After School until 6 pm Open to Montville Residents / Registration Required

*Due to the increased interest in our After School Program, we have a waiting list in place. The ASP is a fee based program. There will be a \$115 registration fee assessed each year your child is in the program. A \$25 non-refundable deposit is due at the time of registration in the program. The remainder of the balance is due 90 days from the original registration date. Parents with more than one child in the ASP will adhere to a tiered payment plan: 1st child- \$115, 2nd child- \$85, 3rd child-\$55, 4th child- \$25. (Parents who have a child/children placed on the waiting list will not be required to pay the ASP fee until a spot opens in the After School Program.)

Montville ASP operates as a latch key prevention program for Montville students in grades 4 – 12. Students who attend the After School Program can choose between a wide variety of recreational and educational activities. Such Activities include: supervised homework help, computer access, outdoor recreational activities, pool, air hockey, video game systems and much more. The After School Program offers students occasional trips and special activities throughout the year. Completed registration forms must be dropped off in person. 

Coming to Montville High August 2015

Beginning August 2015, UCFS will begin providing preventive healthcare, medical treatment and behavioral health services to students enrolled at Montville High School.

What is a school based health center (SBHC)?

The UCFS school based health center at Montville High School is a doctor's office inside of your child's school. The services are provided by an APRN (advanced practice registered nurse) and behavioral health clinician who are experts in adolescent health and are employed by UCFS. Services at the UCFS SBHC are intended to supplement the care your child receives at their pediatrician's office. The UCFS SBHC staff communicate with your child's pediatrician to keep them updated about the care your child receives at the UCFS SBHC.

The goals of a SBHC are to:

- Help students stay in school to receive needed care rather than have to leave campus.
- Improve students' academic achievement by taking care of medical, dental and behavioral health needs that can make learning difficult.
- Remove barriers to care such as lack of transportation or insurance; and support school staff through wellness and educational events.

What services are provided at the SBHC?

UCFS SBHC services include: yearly well-child examinations, vaccinations, sports physicals, acute care visits (e.g. sick visits, lacerations, injuries, etc.) and chronic care visits (e.g. asthma, ADHD, etc.). We encourage early intervention and prevention through prompt medical treatment and education. The behavioral health clinician provides mental health assessments, substance abuse screenings and counseling. The APRN and Behavioral Health Clinician work closely with the school nurse to ensure effective communication. The dental hygienist will be on site several days each year to provide oral health screenings, x-rays, fluoride treatment and cleanings.

Who can be seen at the SBHC?

Any student with a signed consent form who attends Montville High School or the PBL Campus/Pathways may be seen at the UCFS SBHC.

Will these services be billed to my insurance?

Yes, services provided at the UCFS SBHC will be billed to the identified insurance. Copays will be billed to responsible party. If your child is uninsured, please call our Access to Care Program at 860-822-4798 for a free insurance eligibility assessment.

How do I register my child for the SBHC?

Registration forms can be found on the UCFS School Based Health Center link on the Montville High School website or by calling 860-822-4914. Registration forms can also be found in the nurse's office.
