## **Tax Office**

We are looking forward to the summer!!!!! We enjoy seeing you all in July!



As a reminder, tax bills will be mailed out June 30th. These bills will be due July 1st, and may be paid without penalty until

August 1, 2017. If you do not receive a bill, please contact our office at 860-487-3111 or email me at collector@willingtonct.org.

Please note, that per §12-130 "Failure to send out or receive any such bill or statement shall not invalidate the tax." Or in simpler terms, failure to receive a tax bill does not relieve the tax payer of his/her responsibility for the payment of taxes or delinquent charges. So please make sure to reach out to our office if you do not receive an expected bill.

#### WHAT AM I BEING TAXED ON?

You are being taxed on Real Estate, Personal Property and Motor Vehicles as of October 1, 2016.

Real Estate - All real property listed on the Grand List.

**Personal Property** – In the most general terms, personal property is everything subject to ownership, excluding land, any interest

in land or any permanent improvement thereon. It is property that is not permanently affixed to or part of real estate. By its very nature then, personal property is moveable. This broad definition includes tangible items such as airplanes, campers, unregistered vehicles, items for business as furniture, fixtures, equipment, and animals.

**Registered Motor Vehicles** – Vehicles listed with the Department of Motor Vehicles are coded by tax town, and the Assessor is provided a list of registered vehicles annually. Willington's Town Code is 160.

All tax bills are mailed directly to property owners unless the Tax Collector receives specific instructions to send the bill to your bank or financial institution.

Real Estate and Personal Property tax totaling \$100 or more are due in two installments; July and January. Motor vehicle tax is due in one installment in July. Please note, we do not send out bills for the second installment in January. There is a stub on the July bills for the January payment.

## **Events Presents ~ Skip's Wastewater Services**



In March of 1958, Peter Skipper purchased a small septic business from Sherwood Downes of Ellington, CT which consisted of a 1941 Ford Tank Truck and a handful of customers. Today, Skips Wastewater Services specializes in septic pumping, inspections, repairs and installations. The company has grown to thirty employees and close to twenty five thousand customers. The company's fleet has expanded to nine pump trucks,

eleven service vehicles, five dump trucks, and over a dozen pieces of excavating equipment.

With three-full time septic inspectors on staff, Skips Wastewater Services is able to perform over 1600 septic inspections per year. Each septic inspection is a visual inspection and utilizes the use of a fiber-optic camera to visually view the condition of subsurface components. This visual inspection is accompanied by a typed septic report emailed to the customer the next business day.

With over 130 septic installs per year, Skips Wastewater Services has the experience and expertise on staff to complete the job on time and correctly. #### **FISHING & HUNTING**

Springtime is in the air and that means fishing. Opening day for Trout Fishing was April 8, 2017, second Saturday in April. Licenses are available in the Town Clerk's Office or online at www.ct.gov/deep. The Guide Books are available online at www.ct.gov/deep/fishing or www.ct.gov/deep/hunting or are in the Town Clerk's Office. You can contact DEEP by phone 860-424-3105 with any additional questions. Any Connecticut Resident 65 years of age or older is entitled to a free license. Anyone with a "Lifetime" has to renew each year if you are a hunter or if you salt water fish. Make sure you bring in your old license with the conservation number on it.

#### **DOG LICENSES**

June is the time to register your dog. You will receive renewal reminders at the end of May 2017. There is a fee of \$8.00 for a spayed/neutered dog and a \$19.00 fee for male/female dog. You can license your dog in person or by mail. All dog license requests must be received in this office in person or in the office via the mail by June 30th. An updated rabies certificate, if not current is required, a check payable to the Willington Town Clerk and a self addressed, stamped envelope should be included, if by mail. New dogs being registered would need the rabies certificate, spayed/neutered papers, check payable to Willington Town Clerk and a self-addressed, stamped envelope, if mailed, for us to process your license. Please register your dog in June to avoid additional late fees as of July 1st. There is a \$1.00 per month fee and \$1.00 each additional month per state statute.



#### **Knowlton Property:**

Mason Road - Hiking Trails

Willington's Public Works Department recently finished constructing a parking lot for hiking trail access on Mason Road. This lot will allow safe parking for access to the Talmadge Spur Trail and the Knowlton Spur Trail. Both trails connect to the Nipmuck Trail, part of the Connecticut Blue Trail System.

#### **Talmadge Tract:**

Mason Road - Hiking Trails (adjacent to the Knowlton Property)

#### **Chenes Roches Preserve:**

The heavily forested Chenes Roches Preserve has wide trails that give visitors access to the property's interior, which contains a large, old white oak tree. The property lies among wet and wooded areas, including several springs that flow into the Willimantic River through a small stream. Behind Chenes Roches is a dramatic ridge line created by a series of fault lines parallel to the river. Chenes Roches has several great examples of large glacial erratics. Chenes Roches Preserve is located at 65 Blair Road, Willington, CT and is approximately 55 acres.

#### River Road Athletic Complex - 511 River Road:

Baseball field, basketball court, pavilion, playscape, swings, multi-sport field, volleyball sand court, walking path (one lap = .33 miles) and outdoor fitness equipment. No golfing allowed. Dogs are welcome but must be leashed and cleaned up after. Doggie poo bags are available. Complex is CARRY IN-CARRY OUT. Dogs are not allowed on the baseball field. \*\*State Statute 22-364 states that dogs must be under the direct control of their owners at all times when using town parks. It is the dog owner's responsibility to clean up all dog waste.

Baseball and softball fields

Overlooking the Roaring Brook, a popular fishing spot during fishing season.

## **Vet Corner: Monitor Your Pets Closely for Ticks**

Believe it or not, spring is here! However, despite the snowfall, all winter we have seen ticks finding their way onto many of our patients. Ticks carry many diseases, primarily Lyme, Anaplasmosis and Ehrlichiosis, which are the ones we most commonly test for. Recently, we have started to diagnose Rocky Mountain Spotted Fever in dogs that have only ever lived in CT! We can almost assume there are other diseases out there that we either don't know about or don't routinely test for. Ticks are literally crawling disease factories!!

Many tick-borne diseases, like Lyme, can be transmitted rather quickly after a tick attaches to your dog. Lyme is an extremely prevalent disease in this area. It is estimated that up to 40% of deer ticks in the northeast carry Lyme disease. The ticks that spread this disease can be very difficult to see on your pet. When ticks are in the nymph stage they can be smaller

than the period at the end of this sentence. Imagine trying to find that tiny tick on your fur-covered friend! Even the best tick preventatives cannot definitively protect your pet from exposure to tick-borne diseases. However, the longer the tick is attached, the more likely it is to transmit one of the diseases. Utilizing a quality flea and tick preventative is critical to helping protect your pet from disease. Today there are many different application options (topical, oral, collar) and application frequency (monthly, every 3 months or every 8 months) that work very well. Depending on your pet's lifestyle and exposure, your veterinarian can help you select the product that is best suited for your dog. One additional way to prevent Lyme disease in your dog is with vaccination. The Lyme vaccines are far better than they used to be and are very effective at preventing Lyme disease. If you have your dog properly tested and vaccinated for Lyme disease and they test positive in the

future, most vaccine companies will pay for any treatment or medication for your dog.

As one might expect, our barnyard friends are most exposed to these nasty little ticks. We diagnose Lyme and Anaplasmosis in our equine patients very commonly. Unfortunately, we are limited by not having a licensed Lyme vaccine or tick preventative for our horse friends. Uncomplicated cases of Lyme disease are relatively easy to treat in dogs, yet can be very challenging in horses, leading to many persistent and chronic conditions.

Bottom line, monitor your pets closely for ticks and talk to your veterinarian about the best way to protect your animals from deadly diseases!
