There is a lot happening at the Town Office Building and with Public Works as we prepare for the winter (and budget season) ahead. Construction on Turnpike Road is moving along and our goal is to get the remaining drainage projects completed before the first snow storm. The final phase of restoration of the Old Town Hall is also underway and we hope to be able to unveil it at the Tree Lighting on the Green on Friday, December 2nd.

Registrar of Voters

A general election will be held on November 8, 2016 for the following offices – President, US Senator, Representative in Congress (2nd district), State Senator (35th district), State Representative (53rd district) and Registrars of Voters. Voting will take place in the polling room, located on the main level of the Town Office Building, 40 Old Farms Road, from 6 am to 8 pm. Voters are reminded to bring identification. Plan ahead and make sure that you are registered to vote. Registering to vote is an easy process and there are several methods for obtaining a voter application form:

Apply online at voterregistration.ct.gov. Online applications must be completed by November 1.

Call the Elections Department at 860 487-3120 and leave a clearly stated message, including your name and address, asking that an application be sent. Mail-in applications must be postmarked by November 1.

Apply at the Elections Department office on the lower level of the Town Office Building, 40 Old Farms Road, on Tuesdays

from 10 am to 12 pm. In-person applications must be completed by November 1.

Register at the Town Clerk's office at the main level of the Town Office Building during business hours on Monday from 12:30 to 7:30 pm and Tuesday through Friday from 9 am to 2 pm. In-person applications must be completed by November 1. Applications are also available at the Willington Public Library and the Department of Motor Vehicles offices.

There will be a special Voter Registration Session held at the Elections Department on: Tuesday, November 1 from 9 am to 8 pm.

Absentee ballots for those voters unable to vote in person on Election Day are available through the Town Clerk's office. For information on how to apply for an absentee ballot, call the Town Clerk at 860 487-3121 or go to the Secretary of the State's website – sots.ct.gov.

For other election questions, please contact the Elections Department at 860 487-3120, Tuesdays 10 am to 12 pm or leave a message.

FISHING & HUNTING

Licenses are available in the Town Clerk's Office or online at www.ct.gov/deep. The Guide Books are available online at www.ct.gov/deep/hunting and will be in the Town Clerk's office. You can contact DEEP by phone (860) 424-3105 with any additional questions. Any Connecticut residents 65 years of age or older are entitled to a free license. Anyone with a "Lifetime" has to renew each year if you are a hunter or if you salt water fish. Make sure you bring in your old license with the conservation number on it. Watch for changes coming to the fishing and hunting regulations and fees.

PRESIDENTIAL ELECTION DAY

November 8th voting time is 6:00 am to 8:00 pm at the Town Office Building. Legal Notice will appear in the Courant Reminder Paper.

It will also appear on the Town website.

Absentee Ballots will be available in the Town Clerk's Office on October 7th through the close of the clerk's office on November 7th. Any questions, please contact the clerk's office.

LEGAL NOTICE

In accordance with Connecticut General Statute 12-40, all persons who are liable to pay taxes on tangible personal property belonging to them on October 1, 2016 are hereby notified that they must file a declaration of their personal property on or before November 1, 2016, with the Assessor, or be subject to an estimated assessment and the statutory 25% penalty. Various exemptions are explained on the declaration and available if filed on time.

NO DECLARATION IS REQUIRED FOR MOTOR VEHICLES REGISTERED IN WILLINGTON CT. NO DECLARATION IS REQUIRED FOR REAL ESTATE.

Personal property includes, but is not limited to, unregistered motor vehicles (including junk autos), campers, all business machinery, equipment, tools, commercial furniture and fixtures.

Applications and Engineer Evaluation forms to request reassessment of residential property due to defective concrete are available in the Assessor's Office and on the Town of Willington web site. Please note, these forms must be accompanied by an Engineer's report. For additional information, contact the Assessor's office.

Filing deadlines for various exemptions and classifications for the **2017 Grand List** are as follows:

Public act 490

All applications for classification of forestland must be received by October 1, 2017. All applications for classification of farmland and open space must be received by October 31, 2017.

VETERANS

All property owners claiming exemption due to military service must file their DD214 form with the Town Clerk by September 30, 2017. Veterans claiming disability exemption must submit proof from the Veterans Administration. PA 85-573 allows veterans an additional exemption if their income is within the approved limits. This application must be filed by October 1 bi-annually.

DISABILITY

Persons totally disabled receiving SSD benefits may be eligible for a \$1000 property exemption. Proof of award and application must be submitted by October 1, 2017.

HOMEOWNERS & TOTALLY DISABLED

Residents 65 years of age or totally disabled may be eligible for a tax credit on real estate; income guidelines apply and are adjusted each year. You must request an application in February 2017 and file it on or before May 15, 2017.

RENTERS

Residents 65 years of age or totally disabled may be eligible for the State Renters Rebate Program. Guidelines and applications will be available from the Human Services Department between April 1, 2017-October 1, 2017.

The Assessor's Office is open to receive the above lists and applications Monday 12:30-7:30 and Tuesday through Friday from 9:00 am to 2:00 pm.

Solarize Willington

SOLARIZE/Willington Kicks-off SolarPV Program for Residents - We're in!

Willington has been accepted into Connecticut's program to promote residential solar PV. Our Board of Selectmen has voted unanimously to bring SOLARIZE to Willington. For a limited period, until January 19, 2017, we have an opportunity to purchase premier solar systems at significantly discounted rates(about 20% below open market). Through a competitive process, Earthlight Technologies, based in Ellington, has been chosen by the Town to do the installations. Those who go solar now can also take advantage of State and Federal incentives like a 30% Federal Income Tax credit. SOLARIZE also offers low-cost financing through Earthlight and the Connecticut Green Bank.

While SOLARIZE is directed at homeowners, this is also an opportunity for Willington businesses and other institutions to take advantage of Earthlight's presence in town to facilitate participa-

tion in other appropriate State solar programs.

To learn more come to one of our several local workshops: next date in Willington is at the Library, Tuesday, December 6. We are also working with the Town of Eastford, who will be sponsoring a SOLARIZE workshop at Eastford Town Hall, 16 Westford Rd. on Thursday, November 10. All are welcome to attend.

The First Step to Providing Emergency Services is Finding Your House

Willington Conservation Commission News

Forest Management Activity in Fenton-Ruby Park and Wildlife Preserve

Ensuring a healthy forest and wildlife habitat diversity in Fenton-Ruby Park (Park) requires ongoing active forest management. To meet the Park plan goals, the Willington Conservation Commission has been working with Natural Resource Consultants, LLC and forestry professionals to identify and address these needs.

A timber thinning harvest was recommended on 18 acres of aging forest in the southeast corner of the Park and approved by the Willington Conservation Commission, Inland Wetlands and Watercourses Commission and the Board of Selectmen. The timber thinning will be conducted as weather permits between September 24th 2016 and May 15th 2017 to improve growth and mast production from the remaining trees, encourage understory regeneration and establishment of the next forest, and improve cover for wildlife feeding, nesting and brood-rearing.

The harvest area, which does not contain any trails, is located off the far end of Burma Road. Forestry activities, including cutting and trucking, may be conducted Monday through Saturday. No work will be done on Sunday. The harvest and log landing areas will be posted and Park users are asked to avoid these areas for their safety. The rest of the Park and all four trails will continue to be open to the public. Please use the current designated parking area on Burma Road for your vehicles and be alert for occasional logging trucks which will use Burma Road to exit onto Moose Meadow Road.

The Willington Conservation Commission meets monthly on the third Wednesday of each month at 7 pm at the Town Office Building, 40 Old Farms Road. The public is welcome. Residents interested in serving on the commission are encouraged to attend (several alternate positions are open). Avoiding Charities Fraud

The season of giving is upon us but please be wary when opening your wallet to charitable organizations. The Department of Consumer Protection urges everyone to be cautious and get information on your charity of choice before giving.

CHARITY CHECKLIST

Take the following precautions to make sure your donation benefits the people and organizations you want to help:

- Ask for detailed information about the charity, including name, address, and telephone number.
- Get the exact name of the organization and do some research. Searching the name of the organization online especially with the word "complaint(s)" or "scam" is one way to learn about its reputation.
- Call the charity. Find out if the organization is aware of the solicitation and has authorized the use of its name. The organization's development staff should be able to help you.
- Find out if the charity or fundraiser must be registered in your state by contacting the National Association of State Charity Officials.
- Check if the charity is trustworthy by contacting the Better Business Bureau's (BBB) Wise Giving Alliance, Charity Navigator, Charity Watch, or GuideStar.

- Ask if the caller is a paid fundraiser.
 If so, ask:
- The name of the charity the caller represents
- The percentage of your donation that will go to the charity
- How much will go to the actual cause to which you're donating
- How much will go to the fundraiser
- Keep a record of your donations.
- Make an annual donation plan. That way, you can decide which causes to support and which reputable charities should receive your donations.
- Visit this Internal Revenue Service (IRS) webpage (https://apps.irs.gov/app/eos/) to find out which organizations are eligible to receive tax deductible contributions.
- Know the difference between "tax exempt" and "tax deductible." Tax exempt means the organization doesn't have to pay taxes. Tax deductible means you can deduct your contribution on your federal income tax return.
- Never send cash donations. For security and tax purposes, it's best to pay by check made payable to the charity or by credit card.
- Never wire money to someone claiming to be a charity. Scammers often request donations to be wired because wiring

money is like sending cash. Once you send it, you can't get it back.

- Do not provide your credit or check card number, bank account number or any personal information until you've thoroughly researched the charity.
- Be wary of charities that spring up too suddenly in response to current events and natural disasters. Even if they are legitimate, they probably don't have the infrastructure to get the donations to the affected area or people.
- If a donation request comes from a group claiming to help your local community (for example, local police or firefighters), ask the local agency if they have heard of the group and are getting financial support.

What about texting?

If you text to donate, the charge will show up on your mobile phone bill. If you've asked your mobile phone provider to block premium text messages - texts that cost extra - then you won't be able to donate this way.
