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
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First Selectman's Corner

Parks & Beach Info

McCook Point Park, Hole N'Wall, & Cini Park:

Open daily from 8:00 a.m. to sunset. Pets are permitted on beaches from the Tuesday after Labor Day until the Friday before Memorial Day ONLY**; must be under owners control at all times and it is the owner's responsibility to clean-up all pet waste. Dogs are not permitted on the Niantic Bay Boardwalk at any time during the year. Restrooms will remain open until mid-November as weather permits. Contact the Parks and Recreation office for Pavilion reservations/availability. Tobacco Free Parks.

State Statute

**22-364 states that dogs must be under the direct control of their owners at all times when using town parks. It is the dog owner's responsibility to clean up all dog waste.

No Pets

**May 22 – Sept 8, 2015, AT ANY BEACH FACILITY: SEE BELOW REGULATION State Regulation (Public Swimming Area Regulations) Section 19a-36-B61 (10) states domestic animals shall be prohibited in the water and the land immediately adjacent to the water of a public swimming area when the public swimming area is open for use.

Boardwalk Construction Update

Construction on the western half of the Niantic Bay Boardwalk has begun and will continue through the winter and spring months. As part of the construction, a portion of the upper parking lot at McCook will be closed and access to the Hole in the Wall Beach at times will be restricted. Please look for construction updates and further information on the town's web site www.eltownhall.com or on the East Lyme Parks and Recreation Facebook page.

Beach/Parking Passes

Parking permits will go on sale beginning April 1st at the Parks & Recreation Office. Permits will be sold from 8:30 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. throughout the season. From May 21 - June 25 the office will extend the office hours to 7:00 p.m. on Thursday's. To obtain a season permit, ALL applicants must present their valid car registration at time of purchase. If you are new to town, please bring your tax bill or lease to expedite the process. To avoid lines, you can mail in a copy of your registration, a copy of your latest tax bill (if vehicle is not registered to an East Lyme/Niantic address), the fee (checks payable to Town of East Lyme) and a self-addressed envelope, and we will process your request and mail your beach pass to you.

As of Saturday, May 23 (Memorial Day Weekend), all vehicles must have a parking permit to enter the parks through September 7 (Labor Day). Park hours are 8:00 am to dusk. Lifeguards are on duty daily from 9:00 am – 5:00 pm, beginning tentatively on June 19 through mid-August.

Pavilion Rental

The pavilion is available for full day or half day rental (9:00 am to 1:00 pm or 1:30 pm until dusk) during the summer season (Memorial Day weekend through Labor Day) for East Lyme/Niantic residents/ taxpayers. Rentals are also available before Memorial Day and after Labor Day; Non-Residents are able to rent during that period. Please contact the Parks & Recreation office for information and availability.


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East Lyme Business Organization



Boardwalk Benches Available





As the spring season officially begins, many will welcome the warmer weather by thoroughly cleaning and organizing their homes. The Electrical Safety Foundation (ESFI) recommends that homeowners inspect the safety of their homes in tandem with their spring cleaning to ensure that electrical hazards are eliminated along with dust and clutter.

Interior Electrical Safety Tips

- Locate all appliances away from the sink. Plug appliances into ground fault circuit interrupters (GFCIs).
- Keep appliance cords away from hot surfaces. Unplug countertop appliances when not in use.
- Make sure there is room behind the refrigerator for air to circulate.
- Vacuum refrigerator coils to eliminate dirt buildup that can reduce efficiency and create a fire hazard.
- Any electric shock from a major appliance can indicate an extremely hazardous wiring condition. Turn the power to the appliance off at the circuit breaker, and do not touch the appliance until it has been checked by a licensed, qualified electrician.
- Be sure circuit breakers and fuses are

correctly labeled with their amperage and their corresponding rooms, circuits or outlets. Use correct size and current rating for breakers/fuses.

- Check for excessive vibration when the washing machine or dryer is operating. This can put stress on electrical connections.
- Make sure the area around the dryer is free of clutter, and clean the dryer lint filter after each load.
- And lastly, make sure smoke detectors and carbon monoxide detectors are installed according to manufactures specifications on every level of your home and outside every sleeping area. Test the alarm monthly. Replace the batteries at least once every year.

The Consumer Product Safety Commission recommends choosing the right extension cord for the job, and use it as specified. Extension cords can overheat and cause fires when used improperly. Overheating is usually caused by overloading or connecting appliances that consume more watts than the cord can handle. Damaged extension cords can also cause fires. Extension cords should only be used temporarily. Protect young children by keeping them away from extension cords and unplugging the cords when not in use.

Overheating or damage can occur at the plug, at the socket, or over the entire length of the cord. Hot plugs and sockets are often caused by deteriorated connections to the cord's wires. Look for visible signs of excessive wear or damage to the plug, sockets or insulation. Replace damaged extension cords.

Prevent Overloading. If any part of the extension cord is hot while in use, it is a warning sign that it may be overloaded. Check if the extension cord is properly rated for the products that are plugged into it. Also, inspect the cord along its entire length to ensure it has not been damaged. Do not overload your extension cord by using it to power appliances beyond its capacity. To find the capacity, look at the tag on the cord or its packaging.

Protect Extension Cords from Damage

- Do not run extension cords under carpets, through doorways or under furniture.
- Never alter a cord to change its length or perform inadequate repairs such as taping up damaged insulation. Do not trim, cut or alter the plug blades in any way.
- Unplug an extension cord when it is not in use. The cord is energized when it is plugged in and can overheat if shorted.
- Discard cords that are old and/or are missing important safety features, including safety closures, polarized blades and a large plug face that covers the outlet's slots and is easy to grasp to unplug.
- Check cords to make sure they have been listed by a recognized national testing laboratory, such as Underwriters Laboratories (UL), Intertek (ETL) or CSA-International (CSA).

Safety for the Exterior of Your Home

Check all outside electrical outlets.

Does each outlet have its own weatherproof cover?

If not, have weatherproof covers installed and keep them closed when not in use. Moisture can get into these outlets and cause a malfunction, which can pose a possible shock or fire hazard. Most covers don't keep water out when a cord is plugged into them, because the water drips between the plug and outlet.

Are all outlets protected by a GFCI?

If not, have GFCIs installed or plug in a portable GFCI when you use an outdoor outlet. GFCIs are sensitive to moisture and should be protected when used outdoors. GFCIs protect against electrocution.

Check Electric Garden Tools (lawn mowers, hedge trimmers, weed trimmers, etc.) Are all power cords in good condition (e.g., no cracks, exposed wires, etc.)?

If not, have damaged cords replaced by a qualified repair facility. Damaged cords that have exposed wires are shock and fire hazards, especially outdoors when in contact with moisture and the ground.

Are tools in good condition and operating properly? Do they function in a consistent manner and show no signs of damaged wiring or parts?

If not, discard them, or have the tools repaired by a qualified repair facility. If a power tool is not operating as you would expect, it is usually a sign of damage. Damaged tools can become a shock or fire hazard when wiring, motors, or other electrical parts begin to wear out or fail.

Check Extension Cords Used Outdoors. Are extension cords marked specifically for outdoor use?

If not, replace with extension cords marked for outdoor use. Cords made for indoor use will not withstand the temperature, humidity, and mechanical stresses of outdoor use. Indoor cords are more easily damaged and could become fire or shock hazards when used outdoors.

Are 3-prong extension cords available and being used with the grounded (3-prong) plugs on outdoor products?

If not, obtain 3-prong extension cords with proper grounding (3-prong plugs and three-slot outlets). Products with 3-prong plugs are designed to lower the

risk of electric shock. Using a 3- prong product with a 2-prong extension cord eliminates the protection and increases the likelihood of electrocution or fire if the tool has an internal electrical fault.

Finally, as recommended by the Insurance Institute for Business & Home Safety, trim away any limbs close to utility lines that could potentially pull down lines or even entire polls. It is important to never touch a wire and it is recommended that trimming be done by a contractor or the local utility company itself.



Resolving Differences

Our relationships are a source of emotional support, security, and the feeling that we are not alone in the world. When things are going well, we love and feel loved, we offer support and seek it out ourselves. But relationships always involve differences as well. We can't always see things the same way or rely on the same solutions. If we want our relationships to be healthy and supportive, we must understand how to nurture them through these challenges. Resolving differences can be done in positive ways, using empathy and openness, rather than seeing it as a conflict that is either "won" or "lost." To resolve conflicts in a relationship-building way, we need to follow certain guidelines. Communication must be positive and non-blaming, allowing both persons to state their perspectives without criticism or interruption. Sometimes just being heard goes a long way toward easing the conflict. We need to focus on our own feelings and experiences, using "I" statements instead of blaming or accusing. Listening, trying to understand a different point of view, and a willingness to compromise are all important. So is the ability to say "I'm sorry" and "Thank you." Look upon differences not as creating distance, but as an opportunity for growth in relationships.

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


