In 2013 The State of Connecticut Department of Energy and Environmental Protection (DEEP) awarded Boating Infrastructure Grants (BIG) for Connecticut waterways. These were funded through the U. S. Fish and Wildlife Service with the intention of improving transient recreational boating access for vessels 26' and larger. East Haddam was among those that had applied and was successful in its application. That dock has been installed. It is located between the Goodspeed Airport and Goodspeed Opera House parking lot. On June 19th the dock was officially



opened. Congressman Joseph Courtney, DEEP Commissioner Robert Klee and other distinguished guests participated in its dedication followed by a scenic boat ride on the river, provided by S & S Marine of Old Saybrook. For East Haddam this new transient visitor dock has been a welcome and needed addition to



I." At that time our grandfathers and great-grandfathers made a great and dangerous commitment to freedom. That war still serves to remind us that the traditions of freedom, established in 1776, have been repeatedly invoked, whenever the need has appeared, and often in places far from home. The cost has never been low, many never returned.

Ceremonies in East Haddam spanned nearly a week. On Monday, May 29th we found ourselves rained out again and gathered at the American Legion Hall. Speakers included Emily Ceceri, Ryan Brownell, Beth Garofalo, myself and a member of our community who for over 26 years has known only too well the cost of freedom, Chief Warrant Officer Four David Tozier.

On Friday June 2nd Chestelm Health and Rehabilitation Center in association with VITAS Healthcare conducted a "Veterans Generational Passing of the Flag." This moving ceremony honored the many veterans at Chestelm. The Flag being honored and entrusted from one generation to the next, as represented by a file of ever younger veterans and Scouts, while a narrative of the history of our nation was presented.



Work on our new Municipal Office Complex in Moodus is progressing well. If you have a chance, take a close look at what's happened. A very special and unique feature is the paved loop trail which goes from the parking area on Baker Lane to the bridge and back.

From the Assessor

The Assessor's office began accepting applications for the **Elderly and Totally Disabled Renters Rebate Program** on April 1, 2017. Applicant's total income must not exceed \$35,200 for a single person, and \$42,900 for a couple (joint income), including Social Security and Medicare. Applicants must be 65 or older or totally disabled and bring all income, rent, and utility information from 2016. The deadline for filing is October 1, 2017.

Residents whose motor vehicles have been sold, stolen, totaled, or who have moved out-of-state may be eligible for a pro-ration of their car taxes.

Two forms of proof are necessary to pro-rate or remove a vehicle from the grand list. Residents must bring a copy of the

plate receipt issued by the Department of Motor Vehicles at the time of cancellation of registration, **and** a copy of one of the following; bill of sale, transfer of title, receipt from junkyard, notification of total loss, trade-in papers, or some other document showing the date on which the vehicle was disposed. Registrations may now be cancelled online by going to CT DMV On-line Services.

The Assessor's office has its own web page on the town website (easthaddam.org). Included is information on real estate, personal property, and motor vehicle assessments; property tax relief for seniors, veterans, and the disabled; renters' rebate; information on revaluation; access to applications and forms pertaining to the Assessor's office.

At 10:30 on the 16th the rededication will take place at the monument site on Mt. Parnassus. Captain Comer's great grandson will read the original speech given when the park was opened in 1938. Refreshments will follow at the Museum.

The public is invited to all events.

This project was done with all volunteer help and carried out by the combined efforts of the Library Board, The Museum Board, the Land Trust, The capstone students from Franklin Academy, the Ag students from Hale-Ray, the Garden Club, the state park supervisor and the special efforts of the public works department.

ABSENTEE BALLOTS

For Municipal Election

An elector may vote by absentee ballot due to:

- (1) the elector's absence from their town for all of the hours of voting;
- (2) illness or physical disability;
- (3) active service in the US armed forces;
- (4) religious tenets forbid secular activity on Election Day; or
- (5) service as a polling place official in a town other than their own.

Beginning Friday, October 6th absentee ballots are available from the Office of the Town Clerk for the November 7th Municipal Election. Absentee balloting is a two-step process. The ballot may not be issued until an application for the ballot has been received. Applications may be filed in advance of the ballot becoming available.

To obtain the application for an absentee ballot, call 860-873-5027 or come into the

Town Clerk's Office. Forms may also be downloaded from the town's website www.easthaddam.org (elections under Town Clerk) or www.sots.ct.gov (elections & voting, voter resources, absentee ballot and procedures, application for ballot). The absentee ballot application with an original signature must be on file in order for a ballot to be counted.

Training for Intervention Procedures (TIPS) for Package Stores

Our continuing efforts to reduce underage drinking and other alcohol-related problems continue this year with Robin Callahan, Prevention Coordinator, who recently was certified to train TIPS Training for both package stores (retail sales) and restaurant/bar management and employees.

In May, East Haddam Youth and Family Services collaborated with both East Hampton Youth and Family Services to reach as many retail sellers in the area, and also asked Tri Town Youth Services Bureau TIPS Trainer Jen Buckley to co-train retail servers. The training includes skills-based programs designed specifically for servers and sellers of alcohol. Social drinking is a prevailing custom and generates its own special considerations that the server/seller is called upon to handle. Participation in TIPS Training demonstrates a commitment to prevent underage drinking and other alcohol related problems by using "people skills" to promote responsible drinking and purchasing behaviors.

Liquor boards and local authorities tend to look favorably on establishments that incorporate TIPS training, and the benefits for businesses include: compliance with state and local regulations and the possibility of increased protection from alcohol-related liabilities. We look forward to training restaurant and bar staff in the fall, and hopefully will be afforded the opportunity to collaborate with our neighboring towns again.



East Haddam is a hiker's paradise. We have you covered for everything from short strolls to early morning bird walks to sites with magnificent views, all on marked and maintained trails.

We want to encourage you to think about the beauty of this Town through what we call "connections," the opportunities that arise when you make the connection between adjacent parcels and their varied hiking opportunities. For instance, if you like a longer hike than is afforded on any one reserve, consider starting at the Dean Easement on Parker Road and connecting to the varied trails on the adjacent Hatch Lot. Just pack a lunch, park a car at each end in the marked lot, and enjoy an all-day hike of as much as 8 miles.

Or you might like to explore the Urbanik Reserve at the south end of the paved portion of Foxtown Cemetery Road, followed by a one mile walk to the east through a bit of East Haddam history on the dirt portion of Foxtown Cemetery Road, turning right at the T intersection onto Helon Cone Road. You will soon find yourself in the

Devil's Hopyard State Park, where marked trails abound. You could follow one of them all the way to Millington Green, a distance of about 2 miles.

You can customize many "connections" on our new prize-winning Goodwin Trail. Park at the Boot Rock Lot on Rte. 82 near the junction with the Hopyard Road and walk to one of several parking places along this 14 mile trail, such as the Eightmile Wildlife Management Area on Salem Road, a distance of 2 miles or extend your walk another 2 miles to Gungy Road in Lyme, where you can explore the many miles of trails in Lyme's Hartman Park.

The best part is that maps for all our marked trails are available by logging onto the East Haddam town website, seeking out the Conservation Commission under Boards and Commissions, and clicking on Trail Maps. At many of our reserves, you will find a kiosk with maps and a handy QR-Quick Response code, if you have the phone app. If we can help in any way, please contact Sue Merrow at Amerrow@snet.net. Welcome to the East Haddam Public Schools Section of the Events Magazine!

The 2017/2018 school year is just around the corner and the prospects of this new year at EHPS are truly exciting. From pre-K students to our seniors in high school, our students will experience new opportunities to learn. For this article, I use an example from the middle school to highlight some of the exciting work taking place in our school communities.

In the 2017/2018 school year, we will experience the second year of National History Day. While encyclopedias provided earlier generations of students with the most recent information, today, technology provides a wealth of information that is up-to-date and more voluminous than could ever fit in an encyclopedia. Preparing for National History Day (NHD) involves many lessons about how to research information and to check if information is legitimate and factual. Students learn to identify different viewpoints, cause and effect, and bias in their research materials.

Another exciting change that the NHD process represents is connecting students' learning with their interests and passions. The research students conduct is the result of asking them to develop their own questions about events in history and craft their own thesis statements about the historical events and their outcomes. This approach increases student engagement leading to deeper learning and jumpstarts their process of learning lessons from the past.

The NHD process is completed when students present their information by creating a video documentary, website, or display board that supports their presentation in addition to their written work. These formats allow students to share information in ways that were never possible before. For example, a presentation may have video segment speech delivered 40 years ago. The student may choose to insert digital pictures or videos of letters signed by our founding fathers or manifests created at Ellis Island, or other artifacts available to them online found at places like the Smithsonian Institute. The depth and authenticity of these presentations is stunning.

We are very excited about the upcoming year and encourage you to experience a drama production, a sports event, or student presentation event like NHD.

Registrars of Voters

A Referendum held on June 6, 2017 for approval of a Town Budget failed. On July 25, 2017 another Referendum was held and the Town Budget passed. A total of 1,258 votes were cast by registered voters and property owners. (668 Yes votes to 590 No votes).

Our major party Town Committees held Caucuses at the end of July to endorse candidates for municipal offices. If a Primary for a municipal office is to be held, such Municipal Primary will take place on Tuesday, September 12, 2017 at the Nathan Hale-Ray High School from 6:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m. You must be a registered voter of the Party holding the Primary to vote. An unaffiliated voter may become a member of a major party up to 12:00 noon on the day before the Primary, but unaffiliated voters may not vote in the Municipal Primary. June 12, 2017 was the

last day an enrolled voter was able to transfer from one party to another to be eligible to vote in the Municipal Primary of the new party.





Moodus Resevoir Lake Harvester Program

Moodus Reservoir is experiencing increased encroachment by native and invasive aquatic plants. The Moodus Reservoir Preservation Group (MRPG), a 501c(3) nonprofit charity, is dedicated to preserving the lake for continuing enjoyment of the town beach, fishing and boating.

Several studies by the Connecticut Agricultural Experiment Station (CAES) have kept track of the growth of these plants. Numerous methods of control have been studied by MRPG and, with town and environmental group support, MRPG conducted an herbicide pilot study. Based on independent evaluation of the pilot study, herbicide treatment is not an effective control method for further treatment. "Raking" methods presently in use by private contractors and individual property owners can result in plant fragments escaping and re-rooting in other parts of the lake, increasing the problem.

The most affordable and effective control method is "harvesting," via a machine that pulls up the aquatic plants, trapping them and depositing them on land. An affordable and environmental enhancing method of disposal is available. The Eco Harvester machine will cost approximately sixty thousand dollars (\$60,000). A volunteer is

already available to operate the harvester. Raising the funds will require support of the community as well as outside grants and special events. This will improve the lake for use by all and extend its life for future generations.

The 2017 Annual Meeting will be held on Sunday, August 6, 10:00 am at the Moodus Sportsmen's Club, East Haddam/Colchester Turnpike. Future plans and fund raising will be discussed. Greg Bugbee of the CAES will review past studies. Benthic Barriers for waterfront weed control will be explained and offered for sale. All East Haddam residents are welcome to attend. New members may join and current members may pay \$25 annual dues anytime via our website, as well as at the meeting. All dues and donations are tax deductible.





A large portion of the licensing fee goes to the Animal Population Control Program and the Connecticut Humane Society. Proof of rabies is required to license.



22nd Annual Quilt And Needle Arts Show


