

Emmett Lyman, First Selectman







when visiting the school or dropping off or picking up students. For those who have not had a chance to take a look please visit and see how much has been accomplished and how well it was done.

Our three remaining major capital projects are also moving forward. The "Conversion of the Former Middle School to Municipal Offices" project is well along. The plan for the internal office organization has been the subject of numerous ongoing reviews. We now have

consensus on a final arrangement and we are ready to move forward. A construction manager has been approved and the preliminary work is progressing. A completion date late in 2017 is planned. Our "Town-Wide Radio System Improvements" project is on track. The long promised erection of a communication tower, by the Connecticut Department of Public Safety, on Mount Parnassus Road was the hold up. Tower construction started in August. The "Town Street and Moodus Firehouse Improvements" project has been approved by the Planning and Zoning Commission and they are in the process of seeking bids and finalizing their plans.

Everyone will definitely be "thinking spring" by March 29, when garden



Do you enjoy gardening and getting together with like-minded people to learn about gardening? If you do you might be interested in joining the Hadlyme Hall Garden Club.





### **Spotlight on Rose Farm Homestead**



Have you seen this blue sign as you travel south on Rte. 82 headed toward Hadlyme? It marks the spot of yet another great outdoor experience opportunity for East Haddam citizens. The Rose Farm preserve, acquired by our town in 2009, offers 68

acres of scenery, hiking trails, and exceptional wildlife habitat, and it's convenient to the center of our town to boot.

Your Conservation Commission has made a visit to Rose Farm easier by creating off-street parking lots and tree marked trails. The first, called the Yellow Trail, is a .4 mile loop. The White Trail connects to it with .3 miles of additional marked trail. The third, called the Red Trail, offers .8 miles of hiking in a loop that is reached from its own parking area on Silas Homes Road off of Petticoat Lane on the west side of the preserve. The Conservation Commission hopes to enhance the hiking experience of Rose Farm by linking these two loop trails with a bridge over a central wetland in the near future. Stay tuned.

In the meantime, there's something else quite special about the Rose Farm Preserve. The Conservation Commission recently invited Audubon Society bird experts to evaluate town preserves for their bird habitat. We learned that the Rose Farm Preserve offers especially fine habitat because of its varied vegetation of shrubs and large trees and its bird-friendly wetland area. Woodpeckers, turkeys, and owls live here in great numbers year-round, and it's a big favorite with migratory birds. Warblers aplenty have discovered Rose Farm. If you're a birder, it's time you discovered it too.

A map and information about this preserve and all the others that await you are easy to find on the Town's website. Just go to www.Easthaddam.org, click on Town Boards, then click on Conservation Commission, and locate the Trail Maps section. Come out soon and visit this special place.

There is a fee associated with online payments which goes directly to the processing company, Point & Pay, for its service. This fee applies to online and in the office credit/debit card payments. A secure lockbox is located

in the front hallway for payments dropped off after normal business hours. Anyone wishing a receipt must include a self-addressed, stamped envelope with their payment.

### A Note from the Assessor

All persons having taxable personal property to declare such as: unregistered motor vehicles, horses and ponies, farm equipment, or any furniture, fixtures, and equipment used in the operation of a business, must do so by November 1, 2016. Declaration forms are available at the Assessor's Office. However, they will also be mailed to all businesses and residents who have declared property in the past. Please be aware if you have taxable personal property, and do not declare it, state statutes allow the assessor to add it at an estimated amount, plus a 25% penalty.

Applications for Farm, Forest and Open Space will be accepted from September 1 until October 31, 2016. Forms are available at the Assessor's Office, or online at the town website.

Any persons who acquired a new motor vehicle after October 1, 2015 will receive a supplemental motor vehicle bill for their new vehicle by January 2017. These bills will be prorated, based on the date of registration, for the 12-month period starting October 2015 and ending September 2016. Vehicles acquired in August or September do not receive supplemental tax bills.

### **Absentee Ballots**

### FOR SPECIAL ELECTION

An elector may vote by absentee ballot due to:

- 1. the elector's absence from their town for all of the hours of voting;
- 2. illness or physical disability;
- 3. active service in the US armed forces;
- 4. religious tenets forbid secular activity on Election Day; or
- 5. service as a polling place official in a town other than their own.

Beginning November 18 absentee ballots are available from the Office of the Town Clerk for the December 20, 2016 Special Election. Absentee balloting is a two step process. The ballot may not be issued until an application for the ballot has been received. Applications may be filed in advance of the ballot becoming available.

To obtain the application for an absentee ballot, call 860-873-5027 or come into the Town Clerk's Office. Forms may also be downloaded from the town's website www.easthaddam.org (elections under Town Clerk) or www.sots.ct.gov (elections & voting, voter resources, absentee ballot and procedures, application for ballot). The absentee ballot application with an original signature must be on file in order for a ballot to be counted.

### Sand for Winter Ice

Residents of East Haddam are reminded that they may take only a small amount of sand from one of the municipal sand piles for their personal use in sanding steps, walkways, or ice patches in driveways. Piles are located at the corner of Haywardville and Early Roads, and at the Town Garage, off Mt. Parnassus Road near Shagbark. For safety reasons, residents should not obtain sand during storm conditions when operators are loading trucks and entering and leaving the site.

It is understood that sand is provided for private, personal use and is not to be used commercially or for profit, or for any application other than as a safety precaution. Residents needing more than a few buckets of sand per winter should purchase their own supply.



### It's Back! (Snow, that is)

We hear frequent complaints about the dangerous road conditions that result when people push driveway snow out into our public roads. We actually have an ordinance prohibiting this practice, which states, "No person shall plow, throw, put or cause to be thrown or put any snow or ice from any private property or from any area in the rear of said private property or in area between a private dwelling house or structure and the legally laid out sidewalk into any public highway in the town of East Haddam."

As a reminder to residents the town also has an ordinance regarding the clearing of sidewalks adjoining or fronting a resident or business property. The ordinance states, "Whenever the sidewalk, or any part thereof, adjoining or fronting any building lot of land or any street, square or public place in the Town of East Haddam, shall have upon it an accumulation of snow, sleet or ice, it shall be the duty of

the owner, occupant or any person having the case of such building or lot, to cause such sidewalks to be made safe and convenient by removing the snow, sleet or ice therefrom, or by covering the same with sand or some other suitable substance, and in case such owner, occupant or other person having the care of such building or lot shall neglect to do so for the space of eight (8) hours during the daytime, the person whose legal duty it shall be to clear the sidewalk, and so neglecting, shall be fined not more than twenty five (\$25.00) dollars for each occurrence, and every hour of neglect to make the sidewalks safe in accordance with the provisions of this section, after notice from the First Selectman or his designee, shall constitute a separate offense."

Please keep this in mind this winter. Your neighbors will appreciate it.



### **Kid Sight Program**

If you could save a child's sight with the press of a button, wouldn't you? According to educational experts, 80% of learning is visual. So if a child can't see well, he can't learn well. Yet most young children don't get their vision screened until they have problems learning or paying attention in school. By then, it may already be too late. Unless vision problems are detected early and corrected, they risk becoming permanent by age 7.

The Connecticut Lions Eye Research Foundation (CLERF.... of which every CT Lion is a member) through its Lions Eye Health Program has funded WelchAllyn SPOT pediatric scanners that are available to every Lions Club enabling us to screen FREE of charge ALL children from 6 months through grade school, with the primary emphasis on the 0-6 years.

The East Haddam Community Lions actively promote this program in East Haddam's pre-schools, daycares, elementary school and kindergarten. The screenings are offered free by the Lions, resulting in early detection of vision issues and allowing children the opportunity to reach their full potential through referral and follow-up.

Last year, with just two of these devices in our district (Middlesex, Tolland, Windham and New London Counties) we screened over 10,000 children in pre-schools, kindergartens and elementary schools. The protocols we use are HIPPA compliant and everything needed to carry out this program is funded by CLERF. Thanks to a matching grant of \$100,000.00 received from LCI (Lions Club International) and the funds raised by the Lions of CT we will have more devices available this year to meet the projected demand. Thanks to the success of this program, many schools,

if approached by a Lions club, are now taking advantage of this free service when they see the scope of the screening offered. It is over and above the simple acuity charts currently used in schools.



LCI has launched this program nationally as KidSight USA and proudly uses our CT program as one of its models.

Our mission to ensure Free Vision Screening is given to all kids because every child deserves to learn and see the world clearly. It is our

children in our communities who benefit..... there are approximately 250,000 children in our target age range (0-6 years) in CT.

This program is easy to implement. The scanner is very user friendly, requiring no cognizant input from the child. Screening

results from the past 3 years show that typically 10-12% of kids screened in this area will be referred for a follow-up exam by an eye-care professional. Approximately 5% of all children in this age group (6 mos. - 6 yrs.) will have amblyopia, a treatable disorder that can result in permanently reduced vision when not addressed by an early age. The screening device detects risk factors for amblyopia, such as strabismus (eyes that cross or wander), refractive errors and unequal vision between the two eyes, and potentially even more serious issues such as cataracts and eye cancer. It is non-invasive, takes less than 10 seconds, is just like taking a photograph and gives the parents an immediate printout via a wireless printer that they can take to an optometrist or ophthalmologist of their choice if necessary.

### **Chronic Dry Eyes**

Dry eye is a disease that affects millions of people. Normally, blinking helps replenish our tear film which provides the moisture eyes need to stay comfortable. A healthy cornea facilitates clear vision and a healthy tear film supplies nutrients that are necessary for corneal health. The tear film protects our eyes by fighting off infection and removes environmental debris that can cause ocular allergies. The high usage of electronic devices has resulted in a decrease in our blink rate causing red, itchy, gritty, burning, and tired eyes. Contrary to what people may think, excessive tearing is a sign of dry eye disease. Though dryness can be transient, it becomes problematic and potentially vision threatening when it persists into Chronic Dry Eye disease.

A poor tear film on your ocular surface can lead to inflammation of the cornea which can lead to blurry vision. In severe cases, corneal scarring may lead to permanent vision impairment.

Certain medical conditions may also cause Chronic Dry Eyes. Autoimmune diseases (e.g., Sjogrens, Rheumatoid Arthritis, Lupus, etc.), Bell's Palsy, Menopause, Skin disease (e.g., Rosacea, eczema, etc.), and thyroid disorders are only some of the more common conditions. Medications such as anti-histamines, anti-depressants, birth control pills, tranquilizers, and certain blood pressure medications can also cause dry eyes.

Fortunately, there are many treatment options available for dry eye disease. It is important to customize and tailor these treatment options to each individual and what is best for their eyes. Regardless of the severity or cause, dry eye disease should be addressed and treated accordingly before it threatens vision.

### **East Haddam's Important Bird Areas**

East Haddam's Important Bird AreasBirdwatching is one of the great pleasures of visiting any East Haddam Land Trust (EHLT) preserve or other protected acreage where woodland birds find ample and clean water for drinking and bathing; berries, nuts, seeds, and insects to eat and feed their young; and adequate shelter for protection and nesting. Living in a mostly wooded town it's easy to assume that such habitat is readily available, but habitat

Audubon Connecticut (http://ct.audubon.org/) and the Connecticut Department of Energy and Environmental Protection recently highlighted the importance of bird habitat by designating 62,000 acres of East Haddam, Lyme, Old Lyme, East Lyme, Colchester and Salem as the Lyme Forest Block Important Bird Area (IBA).

loss is a major threat to both endangered and common birds.

This acreage, which is more than 70% forested, encompasses most of East Haddam's eastern half, including EHLT's Sheepskin Hollow, Ayers, Hammond Mill, Ballahack, Olde Field, and William Jezek Memorial Preserves. The Lyme Forest Block also includes all or part of the Eightmile River Wild and Scenic Watershed, Nature Conservancy lands, many private properties and several parcels of state land.

Many bird species live in the young and mature woodlands of the Lyme Forest Block, or find food there during migration. Some are species of concern such as the cerulean warbler, worm-eating warbler, scarlet tanager, brown thrasher, eastern wood-pewee, and alder flycatcher. (Find info on these at All About Birds).

IBAs impose no legal or regulatory restrictions on land or landowners. Rather, IBAs encourage collaborative land and natural resource management among towns, conservation groups, and landowners to protect essential bird habitat. (See http://ct.audubon.org/audubon-at-home for recommendations.)

Volunteers manage EHLT preserves to protect wildlife habitat while keeping trails open for your enjoyment. You can help these efforts by respecting that preserved land is home to birds and other wildlife, and minimizing your impact on their home by removing trash and remaining on trails. ### **Moodus Reservoir Preservation Group**

We are a charitable organization whose mission is to improve the quality of Moodus Reservoir through programs to control invasive weeds, combat lake pollutants and improve the lake's water quality and overall health. The East Haddam Town Beach is in Moodus Reservoir.

This year, 2016, we initiated a "toolbox" approach to implement more effective ways to control the invasive weeds.

We hosted an "Invasive Investigator" class held by CT DEEP to train boat launch monitors on ways to educate boaters to identify and remove invasive weeds from their boats before and after using the lake. We built and tested Lake-Bottom Blankets (aka, Bethnic Barriers) to determine their effectiveness in controlling weeds along the shallow shore line. The test has been positive with significant weed reduction after installation of the blankets for 6 weeks. This approach will be productive for shorefront property owners to combat weeds in swimming areas.

We have continued to investigate alternative weed control solutions, including biologic controls, such as Sterile Carp and mechanical methods of control including

weed harvesting. This has led us to a promising mechanical harvester, called the EcoHarvester which pulls weeds for the lake bottom rather than just cutting them.

In 2017, we will continue to pursue our toolbox approach, expanding boat launch monitoring efforts, creating and installing more lake-bottom blankets and raising funds to purchase and maintain an Eco Harvester.

Why not herbicide treatment? In prior years, test applications of herbicides

### **Local Livestock are National Champions!**

Sixteen year old Jenna Sullivan of Moodus has a fairly unique lifestyle, compared to most 16 year olds. Jenna has been raising and showing Hampshire sheep since she was 10 years old. Her flock has grown from two





sheep to more than 30, which takes up quite a bit of any spare time. While "Shear We Go Farm" is a family farm and Jenna's mom and dad and brothers all play active roles, the success of these East Haddam sheep is a testament to Jenna's dedication and perseverance. Not only do her show sheep take top honors in the show ring, but many locals have also grown out her market lambs and said they were the freshest and most delicious ever! Recently, other Hampshire producers have been interested in her successful genetics and she is beginning to sell show stock to others around the country.

This summer, Jenna took nearly every top honor possible at the All American Junior Sheep Show in East Lansing, Michigan, where over 2000 sheep competed. Her Hampshire yearling ewe and January born ram lamb were named Grand Champions out of nearly 300 other Hampshires. In the "Top Gun" competition, Jenna actually earned the highest score out of all the other 360 youth exhibitors, based on success in the show ring, livestock evaluation and management skills, and promotional contests supporting American lamb and wool producers. She repeated again with top honors at the Northeast Youth Sheep Show in Massachusetts and again at the Big E, where she was not only up against junior/youth exhibitors, but also adult sheep producers from all over the eastern half of the United States.

Jenna is now busily preparing for her biggest show of the year, the North American International Livestock Exposition in Louisville, Kentucky later this month. She is hoping the feeding and management techniques she employs with her animals will bring some more national titles back to Moodus. After Jenna and the flock make the long trek back from Kentucky, it will be just in time for the holidays! Jenna and her family will be filling the barn with enough hay for the winter, checking everyone's weight, trimming hooves and planning penning strategies. Ewes will be ultrasounded for pregnancy checks, and have their vaccinations updated. The last of this years' lambs will be marketed to some local restaurants or private buyers, and Jenna might have some down time.... at least until the first lambs are born sometime around January 1st.




