Director's Note

With the completion of the Boardwalk, the Parks and Recreation Department is now responsible for 1.5 miles of a continuous Park stretching from the Main Beach at McCook Point to the entrance of the Boardwalk at Cini Park. Pets are permitted on beaches from the Tuesday after Labor Day until the Friday before Memorial Day ONLY**; must be under owners control at all times and it is the owner's responsibility to clean-up all pet waste. Dogs are not permitted on the Niantic Bay Boardwalk at any time during the year.

Restrooms will remain open until mid-November as weather permits.

DOGS AT PARKS

State Statue 22-364 states that dogs must be under the direct control of their owners at all times when using town parks. It is the dog owner's responsibility to clean up all dog waste.

**NO PETS May 27 - Sept 5, 2016 AT ANY BEACH FACILITY: SEE BELOW REGULATION

State Regulation (Public Swimming Area Regulations) Section 19a-36-B61 (10) states domestic animals shall be prohibited in the water and the land immediately adjacent to the water of a public swimming area when the public swimming area is open for use.

Beach/Parking Passes

Parking permits went on sale April 1st at the Parks & Recreation Office. Permits will be sold from 8:30 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. throughout the season. From May 26 -June 23 the office will extend the office hours to 7:00 p.m. on Thursdays. Saturdays 8:30 a.m. - 11:30 a.m., May 21 - June 25. To obtain a season permit, ALL applicants must present their valid car registration at time of purchase. If you are new to town, please bring your tax bill or lease to expedite the process. To avoid lines, you can mail in a copy of your registration, a copy of your latest tax bill (if vehicle is

not registered to an East Lyme/Niantic address), the fee (checks payable to Town of East Lyme) and a self addressed envelope, and we will process your request and mail your beach pass to you.







How Do I Know If My Child

It's sometimes difficult to know when our child's struggles are things we should let them work through themselves or when we should step in to help them. There are certain things you can look for while trying to figure this out.

Have you noticed changes in behaviors and how they are functioning at home, school or other areas in their life? Is he or she becoming more isolated, or are there changes in mood that cannot be attributed to adolescence? Have there been recent events or losses which could be causing your child's distress? Are any other adults such as teachers, coaches or family members expressing concern?

Let your child know that you've noticed changes and ask if they are worried or upset. If they are in distress, they may not have the language to express what they are feeling. It may be easiest to ask if something has happened that is troubling them. If there is not a precipitating event, your child may still report that they are sad or angry but don't know why. Let them know you'd like to help. Seek assistance from a school counselor or therapist, and always keep the lines of communication open with your child.

Is My Well Water Safe?

Unlike homes supplied by municipal water, homeowners with private wells are responsible for the quality of their own drinking water.

The only way to determine if your drinking water is safe is to have it tested by a state certified lab. Harmful bacteria, parasites and viruses are invisible to the naked eye, so water which looks and tastes good may not be safe to drink.

The best time to test is following heavy rains, typically in the spring or summer. The State of Connecticut recommends testing your well water a minimum of once per year, and drinking water should be checked any time there is a change in taste, odor, appearance, or when the well system is serviced.

In addition to health related contaminants, your well water can contain dissolved minerals and substances that can harm your plumbing and appliances.

In Southeastern CT, common issues associated with well water are low pH (acidic water), iron, manganese and hardness. Acidic water is recognizable by a bluegreen staining of fixtures which is caused by the water leaching copper from copper water pipes. Low pH can also cause fixture corrosion and give your water a foul taste. Indicators of iron and manganese include foul taste as well as staining of the laundry. Iron can cause red staining on fixtures where manganese is noticeable by a brown/black buildup in the dishwasher.

Hard water, which contains dissolved particles of calcium and magnesium, is evident by a white scale buildup on plumbing fixtures.

Over time, pipes can become clogged with scale build up from hard water and appliances will wear out more quickly.

So, if you have a well, make sure to be diligent in periodic water testing. A great resource is the State of CT Dept. of Public Health, Drinking Water Division at www.ct.gov/ dph/privatewells.




