
Celebrating Our Olympians

Madison Land Conservation Trust



Land Trust Hikers

Take a hike with the Land Trust! The Madison Land Conservation Trust (MLCT) offers guided hikes throughout the year. From the annual Groundhog Hike in early February to the Autumn Moonlight Walk in October, there are treks for all ages and abilities. Learn from experts about birds, botany, frogs and fungi during the Land Trust's 2018 hikes. All hike dates and directions are posted at www.madisonlandtrust.org and www.facebook.com/madisonlandtrust. Founded in 1964, the Madison Land Trust is one of the oldest in the country. The MLCT is a nonprofit organization with an all-volunteer board of directors. Throughout the town of Madison, the land trust protects over 1,700 acres of woodlands and wetlands, fragile and vital habitats that might otherwise have been consumed by development. These properties provide residents with over 35 miles of trails to enjoy. Maps of all 23 MLCT trails are posted at www.madisonlandtrust.org.

The Madison Historical Society will host its annual winter lecture series, the Frederick Lee Lectures, named for the town founder and decorated veteran of the War of 1812. This year's series celebrates Madison women who were important in the twentieth century. Local presenters will share the fascinating stories of Madison's first town historian, its first librarian of the E. C. Scranton Memorial Library, its first woman physician, its most prolific poet, and the young women who participated in Madison's vibrant scouting movement. The lectures will be held on the second Sunday of the month at Hubley Hall in the First Congregational Church on the Madison green.

The stories of Charlotte Evarts (1916-1994), the first town historian, and Mary Scranton Evarts (1872-1968) the town's first librarian, will be featured in the second lecture on February 11. The story of this mother-and-daughter team, told by presenters Warner Lord, Pam Evarts Landon, and Henry Griggs, is also that of the founding of the Memorial Archives. Both women were passionate about preserving the history of the town and worked to document the changes throughout Madison by collecting pictures, letters, and other ephemera that tell the story of who we are. The presentation on March 11 will feature Madison resident and CEO of the Girl Scouts of Connecticut Mary Barneby as she explores the history of girl scouting in Madison and its impact on the lives of girls and women. For more than 100 years, the Girl Scouts organization has maintained its timeless mission to build girls of courage, confidence, and character who make the world a better place. Thousands of Girl Scouts and Girl Scout volunteers many of them our grandmothers, mothers, sisters, and daughters - have contributed to the fabric of life in Madison over the years. The Frederick Lee Lectures are open to the public with a suggested donation of \$5. Each presentation begins at 4 pm and is followed by a brief Q & A session. 
The Barn

Boat Rack Rentals

Renewal period March 1st through March 31st. Rack Upgrades – please renew current rack and indicate on your registration form that you would like to upgrade your rack. New Rentals will begin on April 11th.

Beach Parking Stickers & Tags on sale beginning April 4th Residents/taxpayers are eligible to purchase seasonal parking stickers for each registered vehicle in the household. Please bring your vehicle registration(s) and your driver's license with you when applying for your seasonal stickers.

Non-Residents/Non taxpayers may purchase daily guest tags only.

Parking stickers or daily guest tags are required for access and parking to our three town beaches beginning on Saturday, May 28th through Labor Day.

Seasonal parking stickers must be permanently affixed outside to the driver's side windshield or on the driver's side window of the vehicle, and sticker must match the vehicle license plate.



Daily guest tags may be purchased in advance by both residents and non-residents at the Recreation Department Office. Daily guest tags are also sold at the Surf Club Main Gate during the beach season- Check or Credit Card only.

Seasonal parking stickers and daily guest tags may be

requested by mail. Please allow at least one week turnaround time if requesting by mail. Complete our beach tag order form and find further details on the website – www.madisonct.org under Beach & Recreation Department.

Seasonal Rates - Per Vehicle:

Rates are determined by age of registered owner \$10 Resident Senior (Age 60+). Senior rate applies to additional cars if registered to a senior citizen in the household and are \$10.

\$10 Resident Veteran's - Military I.D. is required to receive discount, car must be registered in Veteran's name, and there is one military discount per veteran.

\$40 Residents to age 59. Each additional adult (age 24 or older must prove residency if vehicle is not registered in Madison) vehicles in same household, \$20 per vehicle.

Daily Parking Rates

Resident/taxpayers \$10 per vehicle (must show registration or tax bill)

Non-residents/Non taxpayers- Monday through Thursday \$25 per vehicle,

\$40 Weekends (Fri, Sat, Sun) and Holidays per vehicle.






